### RESOLUTION 2022-47

The Board of Trustees of Miami Township, Clermont County, Ohio met in regular session at the Miami Township Civic Center on November 15, 2022, with the following members present: Mark Schulte, Ken Tracy, and Mary Makley Wolff.

A motion was made to adopt the following Resolution:

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING MIAMI TOWNSHIP PEACE OFFICERS TO MAKE ARRESTS AND ENFORCE SPECIFIED TRAFFIC OFFENSES ON STATE HIGHWAYS, INCLUDING ANY HIGHWAY THAT IS PART OF THE INTERSTATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM OR OTHERWISE A PART OF THE NATIONAL HIGHWAY SYSTEM, LOCATED WITHIN MIAMI TOWNSHIP AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, House Bill 206 passed through the 134<sup>th</sup> general assembly of the Ohio Legislature and was subsequently signed into law by Governor DeWine with an effective date of September 23, 2022;

WHEREAS, highways that are part of the interstate highway system are located within Miami Township and there are permanent access points to said highways located within Miami Township;

WHEREAS, the current population is between 5,000 and 50,000 residents according to the most recent federal decennial census;

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees ("Board") is authorized to allow township peace officers to make arrests and enforce specified traffic offenses by authority of Section 4513.39 of the Ohio Revised Code;

WHEREAS, the Board recognizes that it is in the best interests of public safety to allow Miami Township Peace Officers the authority to make arrests and enforce specified traffic offenses on highways within Miami Township;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that by the Board of Trustees of Miami Township, Clermont County, Ohio authorizes Miami Township Peace Officers the power to make arrests and enforce traffic offenses on highways within Miami Township as follows:

SECTION 1: All previously excluded sections outlined by Section 4513.39 of the Ohio Revised Code, to include: Chapters 4503, 4511, 4513, and 4549 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 2: Miami Township Peace Officers will still be excluded from making arrests and enforcing traffic violations on highways in Miami Township related to Section 4513.33 and Section 4513.34 of the Ohio Revised Code, as specifically outlined in Section 4513.39 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 3: That this Board hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of its Committees, if any, which resulted in formal action, were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 4: This Resolution shall take effect at the earliest period allowed by law.


