Wolfpen Road Corridor Traffic Counters

Some of you may soon notice some traffic counters that the Clermont County Engineers Office will deploy on some of the roads near or intersecting with Wolfpen Road. The traffic volume and turn movements of vehicles using Berdova Drive, Rainbow Trail, Deblin Drive, Elwynn Dive, etc. will be collected by the County in response to concerns that Miami Township and several of our residents have been raising regarding the safety of Wolfpen Road in that vicinity. Wolfpen Road is a Clermont County Road and not under our

jurisdiction, so we need buy-in and assistance from the County to propose any improvements.

There may be a project that could jointly be funded and managed by the Township and County to improve the alignment and situation of those intersections, but a lot of data collection and preliminary engineering need to be completed first. As you can imagine, County road improvement projects take a long amount of time to



complete the necessary stages of exploring multiple options, completing a final design, determining if sufficient right-of-way exists and then finally awarding a contract to a construction company. Of course, having sufficient funding and competing for possible matching grants, when available, is also a part of the process with the goal of reducing local costs. We will work with the County Engineers Office to identify projects that result in the most beneficial safety improvements and compete well for funding.

LOW COST MICROCHIPPING EVENT

The Miami Township Police Department has teamed up with Clermont Animal CARE Humane Society - who runs the Clermont County animal shelter located in Batavia, to provide a low-cost microchipping event! Vet clinics often charge \$60+; however, Clermont Animal CARE Humane Society will be offering this service for only \$25 per pet!

Cats are also welcome! This event is open to non-residents as well! Microchipping your pet is the most effective way to ensure your friend isn't away from home for long. The microchips are permanent identification that won't get caught and torn off on branches, etc. The chip is about the size of a grain of rice and it is injected under your pets' skin. It contains a code that is read by a handheld scanner that animal shelters, vet clinics and the Miami Township Police Department have access to. A special database matches the code to your information so you can be notified when your pet is located!

This event will be held at Miami Meadows Park (1546 State Route 131 • 45150) on Saturday, June 23, 1:00pm to 4:00pm at the main shelter. If you would like to participate in this program,

Spotlight on the Opiate/Opioid Crisis

We have all had to add the names of many opiates/opioids – a class of drugs that include the illegal drug heroin, synthetic drugs such as fentanyl and carfentanil, and pain relievers available legally by prescription, such as oxycodone and hydrocodone – to our vocabularies recently. That's because the current opiate/opioid crisis, commonly referred to as the worst drug crisis in American history, has plagued all regions of the nation over the last decade. The greatest impact to date

has been in this region of the country. In 2016, there were 4,050 drug overdose deaths in Ohio alone and 86% of all overdose deaths directly involved an opiate/opioid. This crisis has become so deadly in some nearby jurisdictions that they have had to use

mobile morgues – refrigerated trucks designed to be used in mass-casualty events such as plane crashes and terrorist attacks – to store the overwhelming number of corpses that have resulted from fatal overdoses. In fact, drug overdoses now kill more Americans than HIV/AIDS did at its peak and kill more Americans annually than car crashes and gun homicides combined. Not surprisingly, the opiate/opioid crisis has reduced the average life expectancy in the United States for a second year in row.

By now, most of us are familiar that a "perfect storm" of events converged in the late 1990s and early 2000s to create this crisis. In the late 1990s, highly addictive, opioid pain relievers were readily prescribed and abused by many in the United States. Once the addiction risks of prescription opioids were realized, regulation of the prescription drugs increased and the drugs were reformulated with an "abuse deterrent." Following the efforts to reduce the abuse of prescription opioids, many turned to illicit street drugs such as heroin and fentanyl—substances that were cheaper and produced

comparable, if not stronger, highs than prescription opioids — which were readily available in the United States because sophisticated supply networks from Asia, Columbia, and the Middle East, had been well established and accounted for nearly for 1% of the total global trade.

People who are addicted to opiates/opioids and who use them on a daily basis commit crimes at a significantly higher rate, as much as three to four times, than non-drug users. Numerous studies have explored why opiate/opioid addicted people turn to crime. Research has consistently shown that serious drug users are unable to support their habits through legitimate activities and must resort to crime to fund their drug usage. The sheer lethality of the opiate/opioid crisis, combined with the prospects for substantial increases in crime and other uncontrollable constraints, have prompted communities and local governments to develop new responses to this rapidly growing problem.

Miami Township has partnered with the City of Milford and the Clermont County Recovery Center to form a collaborative response to the opiate/opioid crisis – The Milford-Miami Township Addiction Response Team. The Milford-Miami Township Addiction Response Team is comprised of a group of police officers, paramedics, and chemical dependency/mental health counselors from the Clermont Recovery Center who visit individuals who overdose or are struggling with addiction to provide them with tangible resources developed to support them and

their families. These efforts are designed to educate individuals struggling with addiction, as well as their families, in recovery options and to reduce the impact to the community by bridging the gap between active addiction and available resources.

Join the MTPD for a Women's Self-Defense Class

The Miami Township Police Department would like to invite you to attend a (3) hour women's self-defense class. The Miami Township Police Department has been hosting this class for the past (20) years with great reception from all who have attended. The class is instructed by current Miami Township Police Officers who are certified instructors in defensive tactics. The women's self-defense class was designed to teach women of all skill levels and ages how to defend themselves when faced with real life situations. The skills taught in this class are leverage based and are effective when confronted by a larger & stronger attacker.

The class starts with a general discussion about the topics of personal & home safety, personal defense weapons, current crime trends, issues in the community, followed by a Q&A with the officers. The class moves to the hands-on portion where participants will be instructed on punches, strikes, knees and kicks. The class participants then get the opportunity to demonstrate these strikes against the officers who are holding padded bags. The remainder of the class is dedicated to situational training. The participants are shown tactical moves to defend against situations such as choke holds, bear hugs, attempted removals and ground defense. Once the participants are instructed, the participants will pair up with a partner and apply what they have learned. Please know, this class is not intimidating and you decide where your comfort level is when participating in this class. This class is fast moving and a lot of information is provided but no worries, each participant gets a DVD at the conclusion of the class for future reference. If you're interested in attending this class, please go to MiamiTwpOH.gov and look under the Parks & Rec tab to sign up for upcoming classes. In 2018, we have classes scheduled for July 21st & October 27th with all of the classes being held at the Miami Township Civic Center. This is a great class for all you parents sending those seniors off to college. Participants do not need to be a Miami Township resident in order to attend this class. We look forward to seeing you at one of our 2018 classes!

- Recycle what you can; like motor oil or batteries.
- Use hazardous products in a well ventilated area.
- Dispose of chemical properly.

DON'T

• Don't pour chemicals on the ground or down the drain.

• Don't dispose of toxic products with other household trash.

- Don't remove product labels.
- Don't regard warning labels.
- Don't use more product than required for the job.
- Don't mix different products.

Helpful Tips for Safe Swimming Pool Fun

If you are considering installing a new swimming pool this year, remember to get all your necessary permits! Swimming pool safety is a top priority for the Community Development Department, and a number of rules help insure that backyard summer swimming remains fun and safe. For detail, please visit the Zoning page on the Miami Township website and check out FAQ #12. Zoning FAQ's can be found right on the home page as well, under the "Zoning Corner" section. Also, take a look at the "Pool Gates and Fences" button on the Zoning home page, which provides a helpful summary and graphics of pool safety measures. Do not hesitate to call the Township offices at (513) 248.3731 and ask for assistance from Community Development staff, we welcome your questions!

Here are some checklists about pool safety:

- Latches must be installed 54" above grade. If less than 54", latch must be installed on the inside of fence.
- For above-ground pools, if the wall height is at least 48" above grade, a fence is not necessary around pool, but if the pool walls are under 48", a fence is required around the pool.
- For the entrance of above-ground pools, at least a 48" tall fence is required around the entrance to the above-ground pool with a self- closing/latching gate.
- If a deck serves the entrance to the above ground pool, the self-closing/latching gate protecting the entrance to the pool shall be at least 48" tall at the entrance to the deck. Latch on inside of fence.

- Gates and fences shall not have openings of more than six inches, if no wire mesh present. For example, if of open-face design (e.g., split-rail), wire mesh must be on outside of fence
- Gates <u>MUST</u> be self-closing and self-latching around pools.
- Self-closing/latching ladders do not satisfy the entrance requirement.



Building a Fence?

Interested in installing a fence this summer? The first step is to apply for a zoning permit from the Miami Township Community Development Department. In most cases, fences are permitted in the rear and side yard and may be up

Yard Sale Permits

In an effort to make it easier to have a yard or garage sale, the Miami Township Board of Trustees recently passed new zoning legislation. In a given year, the first two garage sales (two 3 consecutive day sales) are **FREE** and a third garage sale will require a zoning permit.

In addition, Miami Township will still hold an annual community-wide yard sale event. "Community Yard Sale Weekend" will occur the weekend of APR 21, 2018.

proof could include a driver's license, utility, or tax bill. Vouchers are valid for one dump and can be used through February 2019. Please make sure to follow the guidelines printed on the backside of the vouchers.
