Public Invited to Memorial Dedication at Paxton Ramsey Park



As part of their 40th class reunion, the Milford Class of 1979 is paying tribute to the loss of four National Guardsmen whose helicopter crashed in our community on September 29th, 1979. They are providing a memorial for these men in the peaceful setting of Paxton Ramsey Park here in the Township, just less than a mile from the crash site.

The reunion memorial will include the placing of a large memorial boulder with an engraved plaque honoring all four National Guardsman, 4-park benches with each soldiers name on a bronze plaque, and a military ceremony.

Recreational Fire Safety



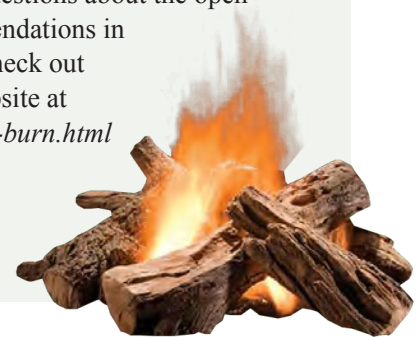

Cooler autumn weather will soon be here. Part of your family's fall fun may involve a small backyard campfire or what we in the fire service call a "recreational fire." These fires can certainly add to the enjoyment of outdoor activities but like most other things, there are some simple rules that need to be followed.

The fires must be small, typically no larger than 3 feet long, 3 feet wide and 3 feet tall. The fuel for these fires must only be small twigs or branches and seasoned fire wood. You are not permitted to burn items such as leaves, treated lumber, furniture, railroad ties, tires or any other items that would normally be considered trash. When these items are burned, they generate large amounts of thick, toxic smoke, which is never good for outdoor enjoyment, and will most likely result in a call for extinguishment. While the fire is burning, it must be attended continuously by an adult; all children must be supervised and there must be some effective means to extinguish the fire if there should be an immediate need to do so. A garden hose that is close by and already turned on is usually the most convenient and effective method. Children should be watched very carefully if they are making smores or any other food for that matter. Believe it or not, a hot marshmallow that touches the skin for just an instant can result in a severe burn.

Occasionally the fire department is called to an "open burn" call. This means that someone has seen the fire and has concerns about it. Miami Twp. Fire & EMS will respond to these types of calls without using emergency lights or sirens. We will investigate the fire so make sure it meets all the requirements mentioned earlier. If there is no issue then we will typically leave without further action. If we determine the fire does not meet the requirements or has become a nuisance fire, we may require that it be extinguished. By following these simple steps your camp fire will be part of your family's fondly remembered events.

Not Your Father's D.A.R.E. Program

The Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) program began in Los Angeles in 1983 and soon spread across the country. It began as a collaboration between law enforcement and educators due to an urgent need to protect youths from drugs, alcohol, tobacco and gang violence.

Though D.A.R.E. gained popularity rapidly, the long term effectiveness of the program was often questioned. This has all changed now as D.A.R.E. has been completely revised.

The focus for today's students is less on drug abuse and more on being responsible and making smart decisions. The D.A.R.E. Keepin' It REAL program's success is recognized by the US government and listed on the National Registry of Evidence-based Programs and Practices. It is effective long term across ethnicities and genders, in reducing usage rates by as much as 70%!

I currently teach DARE to about 1500 students a year in six elementary schools as well as the Junior High School. I also teach about 500 third grade students seatbelt safety lessons and work with almost 200 more children in summer camps. By the time the kids reach 8th grade, they will have had 35 or more lessons with me over the years.

I teach 11 Safety lessons to 1st graders that help build rapport with the young children. This is the same reason you will often see me eating lunch in the cafeteria and playing on the playground with your children. The relationship that we create pays lifelong dividends.

I teach 10 core lessons to 5th grade students. We teach a Decision Making Model that helps students make wise choices. There are lessons on bullying, resistance strategies, stress, confident communication, reporting, help networks and alcohol & tobacco use. We supplement the core lessons with a Prescription and Over-the-Counter drug lesson and two other lessons that reinforce their ability to stand up for themselves.

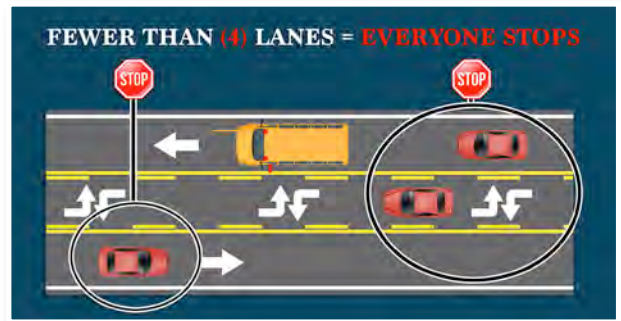
In 7th grade we teach them 10 more core lessons and also focus on Opioids, Prescription and OTC medicines as well as a lesson on response to active shooters. We will be focusing more on Vaping this coming school year as this has been a growing concern lately.

The goal is to build self-confidence to make all of these students more resilient and capable of making good decisions and standing up for themselves. Based on the latest statistics, it is succeeding. The usage rates in this area are way below the national average, in some cases as low as half the national rate.

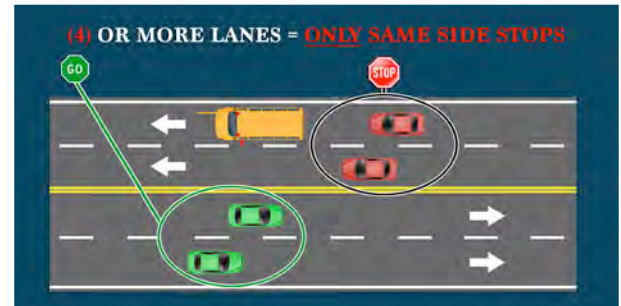
The message boils down to this; "Be safe and be responsible."

School Buses - When to Stop

Drivers can make school bus transportation safer for everyone by following school bus laws for the State of Ohio, as well as the "flashing signal light system" that school bus drivers use to alert motorists of pending actions. The following are examples as related to Miami Township roads.



WOLFEN PLEASANT HILL or BUCKWHEAT ROADS: Drivers traveling in both directions must stop at least 10 feet from the front or rear of the school bus picking up or dropping off passengers. Drivers must remain stopped until the bus resumes motion, or until the school bus driver signals traffic can proceed.



STATE ROUTE 28 (four or more lanes): Drivers approaching a stopped bus from the opposite direction do not need to stop while passengers are entering and exiting the bus. This exception may not be applicable in other states other than Ohio. The reason Ohio has this exemption is that Ohio law requires drivers operating a school bus on a road with four or more lanes to drop off or pick up passengers on the side of the road the passenger lives.

- Similar to a two-lane road, drivers traveling in the same direction as the bus, either behind it or beside it, are required to stop on a road with four or more lanes.

- Violations can result in fines up to \$500 and a suspended driver license for up to a year.

YELLOW FLASHING LIGHTS indicate the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children. Motorists should slow down and prepare to stop their vehicles.

RED FLASHING LIGHTS & EXTENDED STOP ARMS indicate the bus has stopped and children are getting on or off. Motorists must stop their cars and wait until the red lights stop flashing, the extended stop-arm is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start driving again.

Emergency Vehicles and Intersections



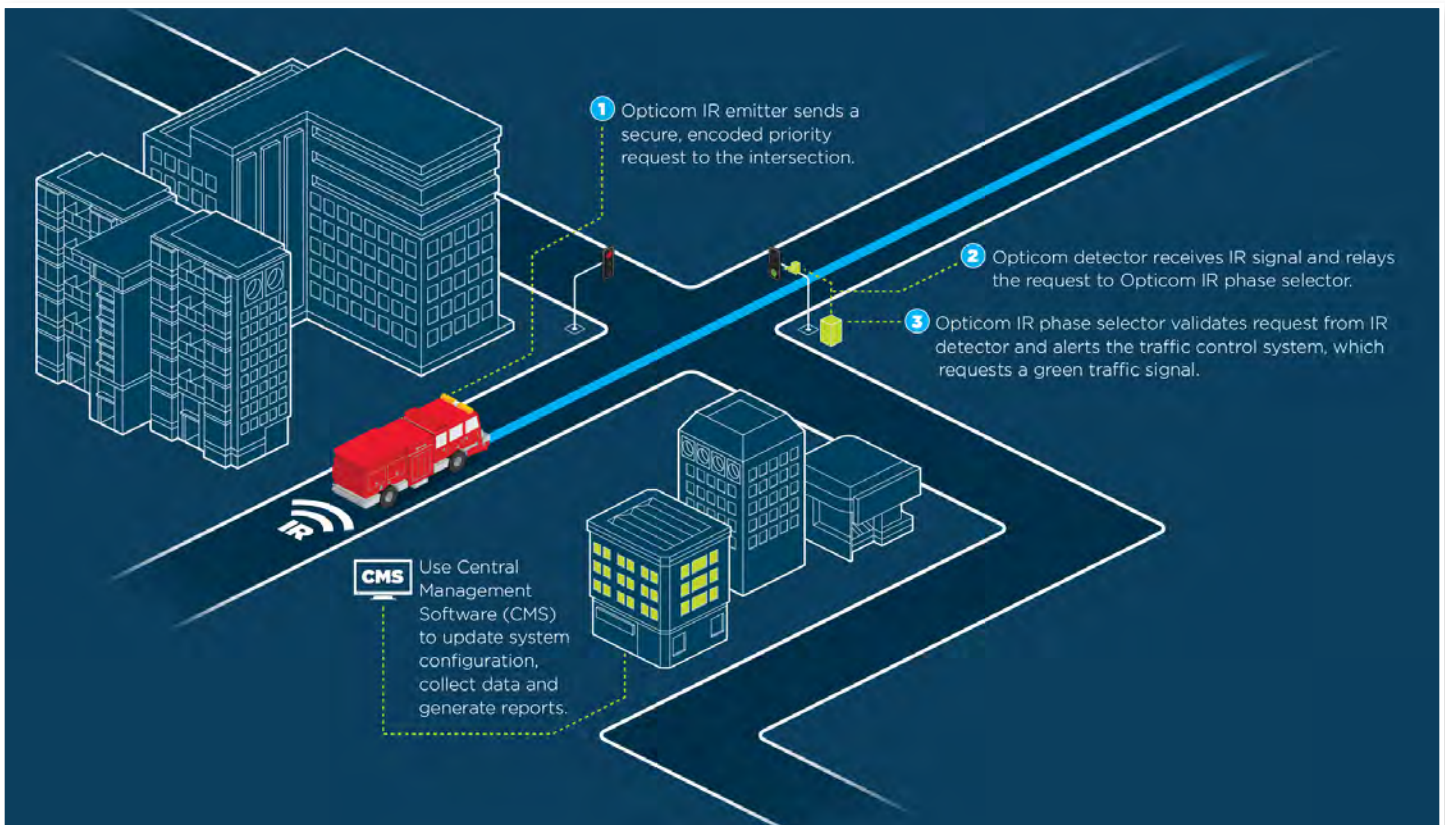

Ever day, countless vehicles travel the streets of Miami Township and utilize various intersections.

Did you know that all the intersections with a traffic light in the Township have a control unit installed on them that allows emergency vehicles to control the signal and direct the flow of traffic? These devices are part of the Opticom Emergency Vehicle Pre-emption system and are designed to help control the flow of traffic through an intersection to allow emergency response vehicles a clear path while responding to an emergency.

Here is how it works. All the vehicles in the Miami Township Fire & EMS fleet have a transmitter installed on them that is wired to the activation of the emergency lights. When the lights are turned on, the transmitter sends a GPS signal to a satellite that communicates with the various intersections that are in that vehicle's path of travel. The intersection turns lights in the direction of travel to green to allow traffic to clear safely and to stop traffic from opposing directions. Once the emergency vehicle passes through the intersection, the light returns to normal operation. This is a timed process, so nothing occurs instantaneously which makes this a safe process for everyone on the road. Additionally,

our transmitter units cannot be activated without the use of emergency lights so you will never see an emergency vehicle using these devices as a method of controlling the intersection lights for convenience. Overall, the Opticom system has a proven track record around the country by helping to reduce traffic accidents during emergency responses by up to 70% and by improving our response times by up to 25%. Regardless of these high-tech systems, we would like to remind everyone to "Go Right for Sirens & Lights" whenever you hear or see an emergency vehicle approaching. Staying pulled over and stopped on the side of the road is the safest position to take. Thank you for keeping our roadways safe!

Usually in Ohio we see addressing done at the county level, but uniquely in Clermont County it occurs by township. Once addresses are created, the address

numbering system is distributed to several agencies, including the U.S. Post Office. To the right are pictures from a recent addressing exercise in the Mills of Miami subdivision located in Miami Township.

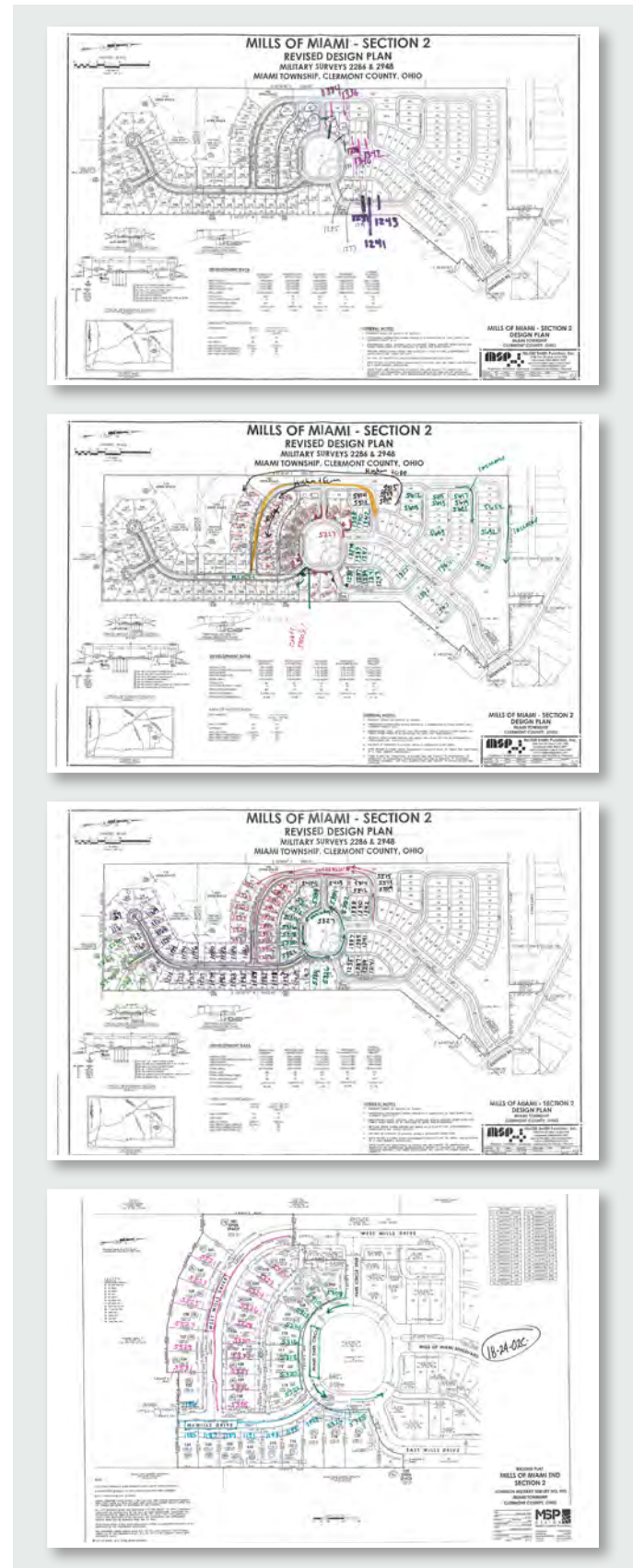
Is there something funny or confusing about your address? Sometimes old errors in addressing can be corrected fairly simply. Common errors include an address out of sequence, and address that is an even number when it should be odd, or an address on a street different from where access occurs.

When serious address errors are found, property owners may receive notice from Miami Township, with a recommendation that an address correction be made. Property owners with mis-addressed properties are encouraged to request a correction, as an accurate address aids in emergency response accuracy.

If an address change is requested, zoning staff will review the existing address ranges to determine if a corrected or more accurate number can be assigned. If it can, with the owner's agreement, communication will be sent to the various agencies announcing the address change. It is then up to the property owner to update the owner's address with utilities, businesses, friends and family.

Agencies receiving address information from the Township include the U.S. Post Office, the Clermont County Auditor, the Building Department, Cincinnati Bell, the Fire Department and 911.
