LOW COST MICROCHIPPING EVENT

The Miami Township Police Department has teamed up with Clermont Animal CARE Humane Society - who runs the Clermont County animal shelter located in Batavia, to provide a low-cost microchipping event! Vet clinics often charge \$60+; however, Clermont Animal CARE Humane Society will be offering this service for only \$25 per pet! Cats are also welcome! This event is open to non-residents

as well! Microchipping your pet is the most effective way to ensure your friend isn't away from home for long. The microchips are permanent identification that won't get caught and torn off on branches, etc. The chip is about the size of a grain of rice and it is injected under your pets' skin. It contains a code that is read by a handheld scanner that animal shelters, vet clinics and the Miami Township Police Department have access to. A special database matches the code to your information so you can be notified when your pet is located!

This event will be held at Miami Meadows Park (1546 State Route 131 • 45150) on Saturday, June 22, 1:00pm to 4:00pm at the main shelter. If you would like to participate in this program,

Clarification for CCW Holders in School Safety Zones



Our recent newsletter stated School Safety Zones are forbidden areas to carry your handguns as CCW holders. This is true; School Safety Zones are on the list of forbidden places to carry your handgun. However, we were contacted by a CCW Instructor that lives in Miami Township named Hank. He had concerns that the newsletter was somewhat misleading. I contacted Hank and we had a conversation about School Safety Zones. He was concerned that I did not mention the stipulation in which a CCW holder can transport handguns within a School Safety Zone. So for clarification, here is the stipulation as quoted in the CCW Handbook in reference to School Safety Zones:

"As a licensee, you may have a concealed handgun in a school safety zone if you leave the handgun in the motor vehicle, the handgun does not leave the vehicle and, if you leave the vehicle, you lock the vehicle."

I would not feel comfortable posting this information without passing on some related information. I have been telling Miami Township residents for years to not leave anything of value in their vehicles. Theft from vehicles is not uncommon. I would be apprehensive about telling anyone to leave a firearm in a vehicle at any time without the vehicle being under constant supervision or having a secure container bolted in the car such as a safe.

I hope this follow up has cleared up any confusion about School Safety Zones. Thank you Hank for bringing this to our attention. Stay safe!

Spotlight on the Opiate/Opioid Crisis

We have all had to add the names of many opiates/opioids – a class of drugs that include the illegal drug heroin, synthetic drugs such as fentanyl and carfentanil, and pain relievers available legally by prescription, such as oxycodone and hydrocodone – to our vocabularies recently. That's because the current opitate/opioid crisis, commonly

referred to as the worst drug crisis in American history, has plagued all regions of the nation over the last decade. The greatest impact to date has been in this region of the country. In 2016, there were 4,050 drug overdose deaths in Ohio alone and 86% of all overdose deaths

directly involved an opiate/opioid. This crisis has become so deadly in some nearby jurisdictions that they have

had to use mobile morgues – refrigerated trucks designed to be used in mass-casualty events such as plane crashes and terrorist attacks – to store the overwhelming number of corpses that have resulted from fatal overdoses. In fact, drug overdoses now kill more Americans than HIV/ AIDS did at its peak and kill more Americans annually than car crashes and gun homicides

combined. Not surprisingly, the opiate/ opioid crisis has reduced the average life expectancy in the United States for a second year in row.

By now, most of us are familiar that a "perfect storm" of events converged in the late 1990s and early 2000s to create this crisis. In the late 1990s, highly addictive, opioid pain relievers were readily prescribed and abused by many in the United States. Once the addiction risks of prescription opioids were realized, regulation of the prescription drugs increased and the drugs were reformulated with an "abuse deterrent." Following the efforts to reduce the abuse of prescription opioids, many turned to illicit street drugs such as heroin and fentanyl—substances that were cheaper and produced comparable, if

not stronger, highs than prescription opioids – which were readily available in the United States because sophisticated supply networks from Asia, Columbia, and the Middle East, had been well established and accounted for nearly for 1% of the total global trade.

People who are addicted to opiates/opioids and who use them on a daily basis commit crimes at a significantly higher rate, as much as three to four times, than non-drug users. Numerous studies have explored why opiate/opioid addicted people turn to crime. Research has consistently shown that serious drug users are unable to support their habits through legitimate activities and must resort to crime to fund their drug usage. The sheer lethality of the opiate/opioid crisis, combined with the prospects

for substantial increases in crime and other uncontrollable constraints, have prompted

communities and local governments to develop new responses to this rapidly growing problem.

Miami Township has partnered with the City of Milford and the Clermont County Recovery Center to form a collaborative response to the opiate/opioid crisis – The Milford-Miami Township Addiction Response Team. The Milford-Miami Township Addiction Response Team is comprised of a group of police officers, paramedics, and chemical dependency/mental health counselors from the

Clermont Recovery Center who visit individuals who overdose or are struggling with addiction to provide them with tangible resources developed to support them and their families. These efforts are designed educate individuals struggling with addiction, as well as their families, in recovery options and to reduce the impact to the community by bridging the gap between active addiction and available resources.

Electrical Fires - Minimize the Risk

Each year, thousands of residential, commercial, and vehicle fires are started by faulty electrical equipment. What can you do to minimize the chances of such a fire or if an electrical fire occurs?

AVOIDING ELECTRICAL FIRES

If you notice that lights seem to be flickering, circuit breakers

are regularly tripping or fuses are regularly blowing, or you have noticed the smell of an overheat, contact a competent electrician immediately to check the problem. Unfortunately we often hear AFTER a fire that one or more of these indications of a problem had been present for some time before a potentially avoidable fire occurred.

Another common issue we see in the case of vehicle fires is that many are often related to incorrectly installed electrical equipment (such as sound systems or alarms). Wiring should be of an adequate gauge size to accommodate the electric requirement of the equipment. All equipment should be properly fused. Wires should be run in such a way so as to avoid being crushed or crimped when body components are reassembled, or when doors or the hood open and close. If you purchase a used vehicle with non-factory installed electrically operated accessories, it is a good idea to examine these accessories to make sure they were installed properly.

IF A FIRE OCCURS

If a fire occurs, the best thing to do is get out and immediately call 9-1-1 from a safe location. But what if there are simply sparks or an overheat, or if the fire is small and you can safely try to extinguish it with an extinguisher?

First, if the electric to the building or equipment can be safely shut off, or if a battery can be disconnected, this takes away the energy that caused the fire and that may continue to generate heat. In a building, if there is a master disconnect or breaker, it is best to simply shut it off instead of trying to turn off all the individual circuit breakers. This approach also helps our investigators who will look for signs that an individual breaker had perhaps already tripped.

If you can safely use an extinguisher, don't use water on an electrical fire. A-B-C rated dry chemical extinguishers are designed for use on electrical equipment. "Clean agent" extinguishers (such as carbon dioxide, Halon, or Halotron) are specifically designed for electrical fires, especially those involving expensive or delicate electrical equipment, and do not have some of the side effects that dry chemical extinguishers have.

Enforcement Activity Across the Township



2018 was a busy year for the Community Development Office. For the first time, we are able to show graphically department activity within Miami Township for the year.

The yellow color on the map indicates the zoning certificate activity for 2018. 665 zoning

certificates were issued for the year. Zoning certificates frequently are received for residential construction, new commercial structures, new businesses or accessory features like swimming pools,

fences and sheds

The red color on the map depicts property conditions/activities calls for service over the one-year time period. Service calls frequently involve overgrowth conditions, unsanitary swimming pools, junk accumulation or building defects. In 2018, the department opened <u>337</u> cases, 331 of which were resolved and closed.

In total, the Community Development Department had <u>1002</u> total contacts with properties throughout the entire Miami Township. As can be seen from the map, contact was spread somewhat uniformly throughout the Township's approximately 33 square miles of area.
