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Sidewalks Should be Maintained in Good Condition

New sidewalks properly installed can last for 20 years or more. As infrastructure ages, sidewalks can and do wear out as well requiring replacement – just like streets and curbs. Section 5543.10 of the Ohio Revised Code talks about sidewalk repair, and in townships, the cost of repair is typically borne by the adjoining property owner, including for sidewalks that were constructed in the public right-of-way.



Section 5543.10(A) provides in part that the board of county commissioners or board of township trustees, by unanimous vote, may order the repair or maintenance of sidewalks along public highways, and may assess the cost against abutting property owners. Certain notification and hearing requirements are necessary as well.

The Miami Township Property Maintenance Code (“PMC”) echoes the responsibility of adjoining property owners to maintain sidewalks along their property. PMC Section 302.3 states that sidewalks shall be maintained in a proper state of repair, and that maintenance of sidewalks within the public right of way shall be the responsibility of the adjoining property owner. Questions regarding the Property Maintenance Code may be directed to the Community Development Department at 248-3731.

Miami Township requires that a permit be obtained prior to the start of any excavation, including sidewalk replacement, in the Township right-of-way. Right-of-way permit applications can be picked up at the Service Department office located at 6007 Meijer Drive or downloaded at the following website link:

Officer Willoughby Earns 2018 Police Service Award



Chief of Police Mike Mills presented Officer Hunter Willoughby the 2018 Police Service Award at the May Trustees Meeting. The Police Service Award is conferred upon a member of the department for exceptional action, heroic action, sustained high-level performance, and/or regular contributions to improving the department.

Officer Willoughby sustained high level performance throughout 2018. He led the department in both criminal and traffic enforcement. His work in the community resulted in 155 criminal arrests; 84 of those arrests were for offenses of drug trafficking or drug abuse in Miami Township. Officer Willoughby issued 198 traffic citations, 392 written warnings and arrested 14 OVI drivers and 142 drivers operating a vehicle under suspension.

Officer Willoughby’s proactive police work has made him a familiar face in the community. Many citizens have taken the time to commend his actions through voicemail, emails and letters to the department.

Chief Mike Mills commented “Above all else, Hunter reports to work with enthusiasm and a great attitude. It is a pleasure to present this award to him. Congratulations Officer Willoughby.”

Interested in Community Solar in Miami Township?



A resident of Miami Township has approached the Township with the possibility of forming a solar energy co-op. In turn, we are looking to put together a committee of residents to look closer at the idea and gauge interest from the community.

An advantage of a shareholder based community solar program is that the system **IS NOT** installed on your own property. Participants can own homes that aren't good

candidates for solar or live in an apartment, condo or other location where a solar installation is not possible.

If a solar array were installed on Township property, it may be possible for a group of residents and investors to share the capital costs for the installation, but then also benefit from future savings on their home electrical bills as well as share in the environmental benefits from using the solar array. A solar co-op typically provides participants with lower capital costs than if done individually.

With the warm weather of the summer months, we are all faced with the chore of lawn care. We want to make sure you are being safe while working on your lawn, so we have prepared some helpful tips for you to consider.

It is important to use caution for your own safety and the safety of others while using power equipment. Many people suffer severe cuts or even amputations each year from trying to remove debris from their lawnmower. Remember that even if the motor is off there can be stored energy causing the blades to spin when you remove debris. The surfaces of the motor and exhaust can be extremely hot and burn you or ignite gasoline vapors.

The following list includes important tips

to insure your safety while using your mower.

- There is potential for flying debris such as rocks or toys left in the yard thrown by the blades. This debris can break windows, damage vehicles or become missiles hurting you or someone else nearby.



- Make sure all guards and safety features are in place and operating correctly. These features are in place to prevent injury.

- Never fill the tank on your lawnmower with fuel while it is hot, gasoline can spill onto the hot surfaces and ignite.

- When working on your mower, remove the spark plug first to insure there is no chance of the blades moving while your hands are vulnerable.
- Avoid cutting grass while it is damp or wet, you could slip and be injured by pulling the mower onto yourself.
- Never insert hands or feet into the mower to remove grass or debris, use a stick or broom handle and only with the motor turned off.
- Do not pull a mower backwards as it is easy to slip and fall pulling the mower onto you.
- Always wear hearing and eye protection as well as closed toe shoes. Do not wear flip flops or sandals.

Mowing can be a relaxing and rewarding part of summer, make sure you do it safely so you can enjoy the best part...being finished!

- Have a barrier around your pool
- Don't swim alone
- Don't utilize electric equipment around the water
- Don't leave children unsupervised
- Keep all pool chemicals locked and stored in a proper manner
 - Don't swim under the influence of alcohol
 - Stay away from the drain due to circulation entrapment

Backyard BBQ & You

Backyard barbecues are a summertime tradition. Unfortunately grill fires are the cause of 17% of house fires during the summer months. Following these safety tips will help prevent grill fires:

- Propane and charcoal grills should only be used outdoors.
- Grills should be kept away from home, railings overhead, eaves, and tree branches.
- Keep children and pets at least 3 feet away from the hot surfaces.
- Keep your grill clean of grease and fats.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions for proper lighting.
- If you use a starter fluid, only use charcoal fluid. Never add more once it's been lit.
- Let your charcoal cool completely before disposing of it in a metal bin.

Using your grill safely is one step to make sure you have a safe and enjoyable summer.

Helping with Accurate Census Count for Miami Township

A population census is required by the U.S. Constitution every 10 years. The Community Development Department is participating in several programs sponsored by the U.S. Census Bureau to help get accurate population counts for the Township. Last year we completed address updates for the “LUCA” Local Update of Census Addresses Operation, which provides to the Census Bureau mapping updates showing new address locations within the community such as subdivisions, assisted living and apartment units.

Just this month the Community Development Department signed on to participate in the “2020 Census New Construction Program.” This will basically update census maps with additional new addresses that were created since the completion of the LUCA program.

Participating in with the Census Bureau is important for communities such as Miami Township, which continue to experience population growth. So, joining in the Census effort and helping to obtain accurate counts is good for Miami Township!

What are some common uses of Census data?

- Residents use the census to support community initiatives such as legislation and quality of life
- Businesses use census information to decide where to build manufacturing facilities, offices and stores which create jobs
- The census helps local governments plan for public safety preparedness
- Developers use census data to decide where to build new homes and revitalize neighborhoods
- The 10-year census count is used to re-apportion house of representative seats
- Distribution of around \$675B in federal funds and grants to support counties and communities is based on census information.



What about privacy? It is against the law for the Census Bureau to publicly release responses that could identify the individual’s identity or household. Responses cannot be used against an individual, they may only be used to produce statistics.

So...participate in the 2020 Census, it is good for Miami Township!

2019 Paving Program

The list of streets included in the 2019 Miami Township street resurfacing program has been posted to the Township website at *MiamiTwpOH.gov*. Where necessary, some of the streets will also include replacement concrete curbs and gutters. The concrete curb and gutter work will replace 2,200 linear feet. The total distance of asphalt street resurfacing will include 8.6 miles. This is twice the amount that was resurfaced annually prior to last fall’s new 1 mil street repaving levy that was approved by the voters.



Storm Ditch & Pipe Maintenance

Many people are not aware that it is the property owners’ responsibility rather than the county’s or township’s responsibility to maintain storm ditches or pipes on their property. Here are some things you can do to prevent drainage problems:

- Keep open drainage channels clear of yard waste and other debris. These materials can get washed downstream and cause blockages that result in flooding problems.
- Keep street gutters, catch basins, and storm drain inlets clear of debris. Clear these on a regular basis.
- If permitted, disconnect roof drains from storm sewers. Allowing these to empty onto open ground slows the water and allows some of it to infiltrate.
- Alternatively, purchase a “rain barrel” and allow roof drains to empty into these. This water in turn could be used to water your lawn or garden. Rain barrels have overflows that allow excess water to pass through during big storms.

- If at all possible, maintain open drainage channels rather than installing pipe. Open channels slow water and allow infiltration, while pipes eliminate infiltration and rush water downstream. Plus they are easier and cheaper to maintain.

Individual homeowners can do quite a bit to help protect our streams. While it may not seem like much, small contributions from a large number of people will go a long way toward improving stream quality. Here are some things you can do to help:

- Never dump anything down the storm drain. If you don’t know how to properly dispose of a material, call the Storm Water District for guidance.



- Sweep up driveways, sidewalks and gutters after mowing the lawn. Grass clippings and other yard waste contribute nutrients – a major pollutant of Clermont County streams.

- Vegetate bare spots in your yard to reduce erosion.
- Keep trees and shrubs that border streams in place. These help prevent erosion and filter pollutants much better than grass turf.
- Use fertilizers and pesticides sparingly. Test your soil first to see what it needs.
- Maintain your car. Check for leaks. Properly dispose of used automotive fluids.
- Pick up after your pet.
- Have your septic tank pumped and system inspected regularly.
