Microchipping Event Rescheduled

The Miami Township Police Department has teamed up with Clermont Animal CARE Humane Society - who runs the Clermont County animal shelter located in Batavia, to provide a low-cost microchipping event! Vet clinics often charge \$60+; however, Clermont Animal CARE Humane Society will be offering this service for only \$25 per pet! Cats are also welcome! This event is open to non-residents as well! Microchipping your pet is the most effective way to ensure your friend isn’t away from home for long. The microchips are permanent identification that won’t get caught and torn off on branches, etc. The chip is about the size of a grain of rice and it is injected under your pets’ skin. It contains a code that is read by a handheld scanner that animal shelters, vet clinics and the Miami Township Police Department have access to. A special database matches the code to your information so you can be notified when your pet is located! Accountability Through Technology

The Miami Township Police Department has three core values: Commitment, Integrity, and Accountability. The officers know this as CIA. One of the ways our department focuses on accountability is with technology. The MTPD has teamed up with Axon Enterprises (formerly known as Taser International) to acquire body worn cameras, Axon fleet cameras for the police cruisers, and Taser

conducted electrical weapons. These advanced technologies help create the Axon Ecosystem which allows these products to work on a single network. Miami Township Officers are using these technologies on every call for service to capture images, record conversations, and document events. The sounds and images captured on these cameras can provide a realistic account of the interaction between the public and the police officers. Let us take a closer look at each of these technologies.

The MTPD requires all officers wear a body worn camera (BWC) while on duty. The BWC worn on the chest area of the officers is about the size of a deck of cards. The officers are required to activate their BWC for all dispatched calls, traffic stops, and any other official interactions with the public. The body worn camera has a 30-second look back period, which means when the officer activates the camera it will also capture the 30 seconds prior to activation. Once the officer's shift is complete, the BWC is placed in a docking station where it automatically downloads to Axon's cloud server to be preserved for a minimum 90 days.

All department cruisers are equipped with Axon fleet camera systems. The two camera system has a camera showing the images in front of the cruiser and one providing images of the rear seat where suspects are placed for transport. The front camera activates automatically when the cruiser lights are activated or when the cruiser exceeds a certain speed. The officer can also activate the camera system using the app on the cruiser's laptop computer. The images captured during the officer's shift are wirelessly downloaded onto Axon's cloud server when the cruiser is returned to the station.

Officers carry Taser X26p smart weapons on their duty belts. The X26p is a third generation Taser and is the first Taser to use an all-digital platform. The digital platform allows for regular condition checks of the Taser while allowing firmware updates. The X26p Taser has trilogy logs that record each time the Taser is activated, each time the trigger is pulled, and for how long the Taser was energized. The information on the trilogy logs can be downloaded using Axon software. The trilogy log information is essential when examining a use of force incident.

The use of Axon products and their ecosystem provides a high level of accountability. The information gathered using these technologies provide accountability for both the officers and the public we serve. Miami Township Police Department's use of technology helps ensure our core values of Commitment, Integrity, and Accountability (CIA).

MTPD Creates Corporal Positions

The Miami Township Police department recently created Corporal positions to ease the burden of Sergeants or mid-level supervisors. The role of a Miami Township Sergeant is to supervise the day-to-day activities of the officers assigned to patrol functions. The role of the Corporal is to assist the Sergeant with these responsibilities. The Corporal position previously existed within the department but was later phased out when the last remaining Corporal, Glenn

Evans, passed away in December of 2013. At that time, there was less of a need for the Corporal position. Time went on, call volume increased, as did the serious nature of the types of calls to which officers respond. Vicarious liability being what it is in the modern age, it only makes sense to have another supervisor on shift to assist in responsibilities.

Under current policy, Sergeants are required to respond with patrol officers on certain calls. For example, a supervisor must be present on all death scenes, uses of force, complaints, or any situation that might raise public scrutiny. If a Sergeant is already on one of these scenes, he/she obviously cannot be in two places at once and therefore it is a good practice to have another supervisor ready to go.

In early January 2020, the MTPD began accepting letters of interest from qualified patrol officers. The interested officers were required to meet these minimum standards:

- Must have at least six years of experience as a police officer.
- Must have at least 18 months with MTPD.
- Ability to obtain a certificate for First Line Supervision Skills or equivalent within 12 months of assignment.
- Must have a satisfactory work history related to annual evaluations.
- May not have had any disciplinary action within the past 12 months stronger than a written verbal warning.
- Must have an acceptable attendance record within the past 24 months.
- Must present a physically fit appearance and correctly wear the duty uniform.
- A written recommendation by Immediate Supervisor.
- Has experience speaking before groups and/or as an instructor of law enforcement topics.
- Demonstrated ability to use the following Microsoft Office Applications: Internet Explorer, Outlook, Word, PowerPoint, and Excel.
- Ability to use social media such as Facebook and Twitter.
- Have received an overall assessment of exceptional or satisfactory or a similar suited evaluated ranking during the last three years evaluations.

After determining the qualified candidates, the prospective Corporals underwent a testing process that included a written and physical examination and an oral board to determine their level of competency and fitness. After successful completion of the testing process, four candidates were chosen for specialized assignment as Corporals.

The addition of the newly appointed Corporals ensures a supervisor will always be present to oversee day-to-day patrol functions, complete the mission of the Miami Township police department and serve the citizens of Miami Township.

Kids in Hot Vehicles - Look Before You Leave

The first day of summer is quickly approaching and along with the increasing temperatures comes the risk of heat-related emergencies such as vehicular heatstroke affecting children between the ages of 0-4. An average of 40 children per year are killed after being left in a car with no ventilation.

The primary causes include:

1. A caregiver forgetting a child in a vehicle.
2. A child gaining access to a vehicle.
3. Someone knowingly leaving a child in a vehicle.

This year, Miami Township Fire and EMS (MTF&EMS) is focusing on awareness and prevention related to heatstroke death of children left in vehicles. There are more than 2,000 children under the age of 5 years old that live in Miami Township. Children in this age range are required to be in a car seat when in a vehicle and can inadvertently become a victim of vehicular heatstroke. According to the National Safety Council (*nsc.org*), since 1998 more than 800 children have died from vehicular heatstroke; 24% have occurred in employer parking lots while the parent or caregiver was at work.

It is important to note that the interior temperature of a vehicle will quickly increase when exposed to heat even on a mild, cloudy day. The Cincinnati Children’s Hospital Medical Center states that children’s bodies overheat easily, especially children under 4 years old. When left in a hot vehicle, a young child’s body temperature may increase three to five times as quickly as an adult.

Prevention is key for vehicle-related heatstroke. Parents and caregivers must:

1. Never leave a child in a car alone, not even briefly.
2. Keep vehicles locked so that children can’t get into a vehicle unassisted on their own.
3. Create reminders and put something near the child that is needed when a destination is reached such as a purse or wallet.
4. Call 911 if a child is seen alone in a car.

2. National Highway Traffic Safety Administration – (*nsc.org/road-safety/safety-topics/child-passenger-safety/kids-hot-cars*). MTF&EMS will be handing out a rearview mirror hangtag for all car seat inspections/installations that is based upon the NHTSA’s campaign.
3. National Safety Council – various information and a free online course about the danger of vehicular heatstroke in children (*nsc.org/road-safety/safety-topics/child-passenger-safety/kids-hot-cars*).

To date, there has been no heatstroke deaths of children left in vehicles in Miami Township and only two in the state of Ohio. VIRTUAL PERMITS

The Community Development Department previously was forming a policy to accept and process zoning certificate applications virtually. With the onset of the Covid 19 health emergency, and having a draft plan essentially created, the Department decided to go ahead and implement the complete virtual application process in order to keep issuing permits. The Department's ability to accept credit card payments, which is convenient to the customers and a useful way to receive application fees while maintaining safe distancing, turned out to be a key element. Essentially, after conferring with staff, a completed application form with necessary drawings and plans is submitted. Payment is phoned in separately. After review by staff, a permit is created and converted to PDF form, then e-mailed to the applicant. As of May 19, 2020, more than 140 zoning certificates were applied for and issued in a complete virtual setting.

In addition to permitting, the Miami Township Zoning Commission and the Board of Zoning Appeals needed to continue business so that project review could proceed. Under special authorization by the State of Ohio, both Boards have completed virtual meetings via online platforms. Board members, staff, applicants and interested members of the public participated remotely from their own homes or offices. Several meetings have been held this way successfully, and it may be necessary to continue in this format dependent upon state separation orders.

TEMPORARY FORBEARANCE to Re-establish Business Operations



For businesses attempting to re-open, especially restaurants, the Community Development Department has been issuing temporary forbearance letters. This allows a business to temporarily use spaces that might normally be prohibited under zoning. An example would include expanding an outdoor seating area into parking spaces to maintain required distancing. If your business has a particular need related to re-establishing operations, please contact the Community Development Department and we can provide details on temporary forbearance to help you get up and running.
