Study Reveals Street Pavement Conditions



Miami Township is responsible for the maintenance of 156 miles of streets within our community. The Township's current street repaving budget is derived from the motor vehicle registration fund and permissive tax and only allows between four and five miles of streets to be repaved annually. Understandably, every year residents and homeowner associations make requests for dozens of streets in the Township to be repaved. Unfortunately, the number of streets that need to be paved is far greater than the amount of funds available for paving. The Township is faced with a situation where there are not enough funds to keep up with the number of roads that need to be paved in our Township.

In order to begin to address this problem, the Township engaged the assistance of Stantec Engineering to use its high tech equipment to scan and record the asphalt and curbs and gutters on every street in the Township. The results were placed into a database by several categories to compare conditions. This data can be used to prioritize next year's street repaving program, and it can



be used with County water and sewer projects and private utilities to coordinate future utility replacement projects. One rating provided to the Township was the Pavement Quality Index which is useful as it rates every street on a scale of 1-100, with 100 being the best pavement quality. The results revealed that more than 40% of the Township streets were rated in poor condition and in need of paving.

After receiving these results and determining that limited current funds cannot keep up with demand, the Trustees decided to place a road paving levy on the ballot and allow residents to determine if they want to see their roads improved in a more timely manner. Using current funds and resources, it would take nearly 39 years for every road in the Township to be paved. If voters approved a road levy, that could occur in just 12 years.

Regardless, having the objective and measurable data to determine the true condition of each street in the Township will allow us to better manage future paving projects in an equitable manner and maximize the limited repaving budget.

Store Up on Fire Safety Tips This Fall

The cooler days and nights of autumn reminds us to get ready for cold weather indoor fire safety.

HEATING WITH WOOD

Wood stoves and fireplaces cause many home fires every year. We must be extra careful to use them safely as they can each present a significant fire hazard. Keep everything that will burn at least 3 feet away. Your chimney needs to be inspected every year and cleaned to remove creosote, a hard black substance that can cause a chimney fire. Don't use large amounts of paper or cardboard to building a roaring fire in your wood stove or fireplace. A glass or wire screen in front of the fireplace opening will prevent sparks from jumping out. A spark from the fireplace can easily ignite any flammable or combustible close by. Never burn charcoal indoors, burning charcoal gives off poisonous carbon monoxide gas. Don't use flammable liquids to start a fire or add to a fire that is already lit. Be sure your fireplace fire is out before you go to bed. When you clean out your fireplace or wood stove, put the ashes in a metal container. Keep them outside and away from the house or garage.



KEEPING WARM WITH SPACE HEATERS

Space heaters should be kept 3 feet away from flammable and combustible materials. Make sure your heater is on a level surface. Keep your space heater away from where people and pets walk. Don't use extension cords on electrical heaters. Electrical heaters should not be used in bathrooms or where they may come in contact with water.

COLD WEATHER SAFETY REMINDERS

Never try to thaw frozen pipes with an open flame. A fire can start inside the wall space. Use hot water or a hand-held hair dryer for thawing. Be sure your windows open easily. You may need to use them as emergency exits if a fire should strike. Your furnace and hot water heater need at least 3 feet of clearance for safety.

A SMOKE DETECTOR IS A LIFE SAVER

No matter how you heat your home, one of the best ways you can protect your family is with a smoke detector. Replace you batteries twice each year. Change your smoke detector batteries when you change your clocks for daylight savings time. Do this in the fall and spring. Be sure you have a detector on every level of your home. Test your detectors often. The installation of a carbon monoxide detector will enhance the safety for your family.

Your Neighbors Are Asking Us to Help

Slow down, stop at those stop signs and put down those mobile devices.

Miami Township is a great place to live but one of the most common complaints at the police department is neighborhood traffic. We receive on average 2 to 3 calls a day for people driving too fast, not obeying traffic signs, and driving recklessly in our neighborhoods.

Miami Township Police has a strong approach to resolving traffic related complaints. Any officer receiving a traffic complaint implements a T.P.R. (Traffic Patrol Request) in our database. This information can be accessed by any officer and provides the officer complaint locations to patrol while on duty. In addition to the T.P.R.'s, we have speed display signs which can help people monitor their speeds and encourage self-enforcement. We also have traffic counting equipment which can determine if speed is the issue or possibly a perceived issue. Most of the complaints are resolved by the extra patrol and by taking appropriate enforcement action. We also receive compliments for the extra patrols and the residents notice a difference in driving behaviors because of the extra police presence.

On occasion, we take complaints from residents who express concerns about walking in the street when there are no sidewalks. We have received reports of vehicles not slowing down, moving over or pedestrians almost

being struck by reckless drivers. We would like to share what Ohio Law states about Pedestrians walking along the highway/roadway/street. Ohio Revised Code, Section 4511.50 states, "(A) Where a sidewalk is provided and its use is practicable, it shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to walk along and upon an adjacent roadway. (B) Where a sidewalk is not available, a pedestrian walking along and upon a highway shall walk only on a shoulder, as far as practicable from the edge of the roadway. (C) Where neither a sidewalk nor a shoulder is available, and pedestrian walking along and upon a highway shall walk as near as practicable to an outside edge of the roadway, and, if on a two-way roadway, shall walk only on the left side of the roadway."

Lastly, we have learned when officers are checking the areas of concern, we are stopping the residents of that neighborhood. We have heard many reasons when stopped for a traffic violation, but we need to realize that we live in an active community, and this community wants us all to be safe. This includes the driver that is disobeying the traffic laws. I have seen our community come together to help people involved in crashes and the compassion demonstrated when someone is in need, but we all need to do our part. For your safety, and the safety of other community members, start early to where you are headed, and you will not need to speed, put the cell phone down, and move over for your neighbor who may be that pedestrian walking or bicycling.

Miami Township Police Department's 50th Anniversary

2018 commemorates the 50th year of the Miami Township Police Department. At the May 27th, 1968 Trustees meeting a discussion was held between Trustees Robert Sontag, Samuel Potts and Carl E. Wiggins "on the Police Department and how it is to be set up", as is noted in the Trustee meeting minutes of May 27, 1968. Directly after the discussion Trustee "Sontag made the motion that John Parker be hired as the Police Chief for \$7,800.00 per year; and Walter Raidt be hired for \$5980.00 per year for a full-time patrolman, and Cassius Gelvin be hired as an auxiliary patrolman for \$50.00/month. All to begin on July 01, 1968; that Bernard Schoenhoeft be paid for services rendered to be discussed with him at his earliest convenience;"

Prior to an emergency make sure your address is easily visible from all approaches to your residence. Reflective signs are an awesome way to help us find you in the dark!

When calling 911 be prepared to answer several questions including your address and or location. If you are on a roadway cross streets help immensely. The call taker will gather additional information and prompt you with actions to take while the

dispatcher has already dispatched the appropriate resources to your call. For a fire emergency call from a safe location. While exiting the structure close as many doors as possible, this will help prevent the spread of fire. Exit the structure and meet at your meeting place. Be prepared to inform the first arriving units as to the location of the fire, if known, and if everyone is out.

If you are calling due to a carbon monoxide alarm do so from outside. Do not open any windows or turn off any appliances. This will help the crew get an accurate reading and possibly determine where the source of carbon monoxide is coming from.

For a medical emergency administer

first aid if safe to do so. Follow the call takers instructions and stay on the line unless told not to by the call taker. Make sure the door is unlocked and pets are secured. If someone is available have them move cars so the EMS crew can access the patient better with our cot. Have them wait outside to direct the crew when they arrive. Other things that will help is gathering the patient's medication for the paramedics when they arrive. A list of medications and medical history would also be beneficial.

These few things will tremendously help us mitigate your emergency! Stay safe and here's to hoping you never need us!!!

Miami Township Fire & EMS Takes Delivery of New Extrication Tools

June was an exciting month for Miami Township Fire and EMS as we took delivery of new hydraulic extrication tools (commonly known as "The Jaws of Life"). As Miami Township Fire and EMS strives to be fiscally responsible with tax payer dollars, it has been 20 years since our last purchase of extrication tools. While the tools purchased 20 years ago were cutting edge technology when they were ordered, much has changed in the manufacturing of cars that made this 20-year-old technology dated and challenging to use effectively. The most notable change was the

incorporation of high-tensile strength materials into the structural members of vehicles, making it very difficult to cut an entrapped victim out of a car. While our old hydraulic cutters were able to cut traditional steel with a cutting force of 50,000 psi, our new hydraulic cutters are providing a cutting force of over 360,000 psi which is necessary to overcome the strength of these new materials. Not only did our recent purchase provide Miami Township Fire and EMS with modern extrication tools, it also increased the number of extrication tools within the department. Since our last purchase of extrication tools 20 years ago, Miami Township Fire and EMS has added a fourth fire station and has seen a 150% increase in calls for service.

Now that our new extrication tools have been delivered and placed into service, training has begun. During the first week of July, a group of fire instructors from Miami Township Fire and EMS participated in a train-the-trainer session with our vendor for this purchase, Howell Rescue Systems. They have been in business for over 25 years and are experts in the vehicle extrication equipment industry. Our instructors will now be working with the firefighters from their respective shifts to ensure that everyone on our department is familiar with the operation of the new tools. A great big "thank you" to Trester's Used Auto Parts for providing Miami Township Fire and EMS with a large quantity of scrap cars that crews can utilize for this training.

Epworth Heights Plan Never Fully Realized



Epworth Heights began as the Cincinnati Camp Meeting Grounds, associated with the Methodist Church and operated by the Cincinnati Camp Meeting Grounds Association. It is believed the first camp meeting took place in 1874. Camp meetings could last a week or more and were religious oriented. These meetings were attended by many people from Cincinnati who arrived via the Little Miami and the Baltimore and Ohio Southwestern railroads. Camp meetings still occur today in other parts of the county in some forms – Wikipedia has an interesting entry.



Summer Camp Feel - The Epworth Heights' grounds contained a large pavilion which is said to have had a capacity of 1,500 people, tennis courts, shuffleboard, horseback riding, canoe launches, and a hotel. Few remnants still exist today. There were cottages on the grounds for permanent residents and areas for tents.

Several of the streets whose names persist reflect Methodist history - Asbury Avenue and Wesley Avenue for example. Grand Avenue which was a planned circular drive around the entire camp, was never constructed for the most part. The association sold its remaining land holdings and went out of business in 1952. Recently, Miami Township undertook a significant cleanup of an abandoned property on Asbury Avenue.

Why Do We Need a Census?

Under Article 1, Section 2 of the United States Constitution, the Framers chose population to be the basis for sharing political power - not wealth or land. Federal representation in Congress is proportioned via the Census. The Census is vitally important because businesses rely on census data to make business decisions. Census data is also used to proportion federal funds (e.g., grants, programs) to support the states and local communities.

While the next Decennial Census is not until 2020, preparation work is happening right now! This summer, the Miami Township Community Development Department participated in the Census Bureau's LUCA (Local Update of Census Addresses) program. The LUCA program is one of the first steps of the United States Census Bureau process, as the Census Bureau partners with local communities like Miami Township to update parcel addresses – that way, an accurate population count can be conducted for the 2020 Census. The 2020 Census Day will be April 1, 2020.

On the LUCA program, staff reviewed Census Bureau data and analyzed that data with Miami Township data to ensure an accurate count of parcel addresses in Miami Township. Over a decade, development occurs. For example, between April 2, 2010 (the day after the 2010 Census) and April 2, 2018, 503 single family zoning permits were issued in Miami Township. In some cases, housing was torn down, and the census data was amended to reflect this. In other cases, an entire subdivision was recently built, and census data was amended to reflect the new development. Next year, in preparation for the 2020 Census, as further development may occur, Miami Township will continue to work with the United States Census Bureau to ensure that the bureau is made aware of any new parcel addresses.

- All of **Ridgeview** and all of Doe Run Court
- **Lakeside Drive** from Wards Corner to Trail Ridge

We will be treating these roadways with a rejuvenating agent this fall. Signs will be posted when this occurs. This material will prolong the life of the new asphalt pavement.

The Service Department mows, trims and maintains 215 acres of athletic fields and grounds that belong to Miami Township. This acreage is comprised of all our parks, our Civic Center, 3 Fire Stations, our Police Department grounds, the Gateway and some small areas of right of way.

They are able to perform this work with 4 employees who are dedicated to this effort all mowing season. They generally work their way through this list and almost immediately start back at the beginning, only pausing to do mower maintenance and upkeep.
