WHAT ADULTS & CHILDREN SHOULD WEAR

- Hat
- Scarf or knit mask to cover face and mouth
- Sleeves that are snug at the wrist
- Mittens (they are warmer than gloves)
- Water-resistant coat and boots
- Several layers of loose-fitting clothing

VEAR VEAR

LAYER UP

- **1. Inner Layer**: Wear fabrics that will hold more body heat and do not absorb moisture. Wool, silk, or polypropylene will hold more body heat than cotton.
- **2. Insulation Layer**: An insulation layer will help you retain heat by trapping air close to your body. Natural fibers, like wool or goose down, or a classic fleece work best.
- **3. Outer Layer**: The outermost layer helps protect you from wind, rain, and snow. It should be tightly woven, and preferably, water and wind resistant, to reduce loss of body heat.

ADDITIONAL TIPS

- Stay dry—wet clothing chills the body rapidly.
- Excess perspiration will increase heat loss, so remove extra layers of clothing whenever you feel too warm.
- Also, avoid getting gasoline or alcohol on your skin while de-icing and fueling your car or using a snow blower. These materials in contact with the skin greatly increase heat loss from the body.
- Do not ignore shivering. It is an important first sign that the body is losing heat. Persistent shivering is a signal to return indoors.

Carrying a Concealed Weapon License Holder Reminders



Licenses to carry concealed weapons (CCW) is granted by State of Ohio Senate Bill 199, that became effective March 21, 2017. This article contains important reminders of your responsibility as a CCW license holder and is not intended to provide legal advice. Please consult an attorney if you have legal questions pertaining to your CCW License.

A CCW License is not recognized in the state of Ohio as a form of identification.

CCW license holders must also have some form of additional identification to go along with their CCW license, i.e.; Valid Ohio Driver's License or State ID Card. Possessing a CCW License does not give license holders the rights to carry a concealed firearm into restricted areas. SOME forbidden carry zones even with a CCW license:

- Police, Sheriff and Ohio State Patrol Facilities;
- Bureau of Criminal Investigations and Identification
- Correctional Institutions;
- Airport restricted areas and Airplanes;
- · Courthouses;
- · School safety zones.

Upon having contact with law enforcement, CCW license holders must immediately notify the law enforcement officer

that they are carrying a concealed weapon. Do **NOT** attempt to remove the weapon from its location unless directed to do so by the law enforcement officer.

If the contact occurs with the law enforcement officer during a traffic stop:

- Pull your vehicle over in a safe location. If none are readily available, pull to the right side of the roadway as far as safely possible. If a safe area to pull over is nearby (within 50 yards), indicate to the officer with your turn signal or hazard lights that you are attempting to pull into a safer location.
- Do not exit your vehicle unless instructed to do so by the law enforcement officer.
- Put down your window as soon as you are safely able to do so and return your hands back into plain sight, preferably the top of the steering wheel.
- You should keep your hands in plain sight until instructed differently by the law enforcement officer.
- Inform the law enforcement officer that you are a CCW License holder and that you are carrying a concealed
- Follow the instructions given by the law enforcement officer for the duration of the traffic stop.

Traffic Laws & Bus Safety - When Do Drivers Stop?

Drivers can make school bus transportation safer for everyone by following school bus laws for the State of Ohio, as well as the "flashing signal light system" that school bus drivers use to alert motorists of pending actions. The following are examples as related to Miami Township roads.

WOLFPEN PLEASANT HILL or **BUCKWHEAT ROADS**: Drivers

traveling in both directions must stop at least 10 feet from the front or rear of the school bus picking up or dropping off passengers. Drivers must remain stopped until the bus resumes motion, or until the school bus driver signals traffic can proceed.

STATE ROUTE 28 (four or more

lanes): Drivers approaching a stopped bus from the opposite direction do not need to stop while passengers are entering and exiting the bus. This exception may not be applicable in other


states other than Ohio. The reason Ohio has this exemption is that Ohio law requires drivers operating a school bus on a road with four

On a road with fewer than four lanes, all traffic approaching a stopped school bus from either direction must stop at least 10 feet from the front or rear of the bus and remain stopped until the bus begins to move or the bus driver signals motorists to proceed.



TWO-LANE HIGHWAY WITH CENTER TURN LANE

If the bus is stopped on a street with four or more lanes, only traffic proceeding in the same direction as the bus must stop



- or more lanes to drop off or pick up passengers on the side of the road the passenger lives.
- Similar to a two-lane road, drivers traveling in the same direction as the bus, either behind it or beside it, are required to stop on a road with four or more lanes
- Violations can result in fines up to \$500 and a suspended driver license for up to a year.

YELLOW FLASHING

LIGHTS indicate the bus is preparing to stop to load or unload children. Motorists should slow down and prepare to stop their vehicles.

RED FLASHING LIGHTS & EXTENDED STOP ARMS indicate the bus has stopped and children are

getting on or off. Motorists must stop their cars and wait until the red

lights stop flashing, the extended stop-arm is withdrawn, and the bus begins moving before they can start driving again.

Driving in Winter Weather

Even with the best maintenance and cautious driving, snow, ice and freezing temperatures can sometimes still get the best of your

vehicle. Hazardous winter driving conditions induce many accidents, which is the leading cause of death during winter storms. Being prepared to handle potential slideoffs, accidents, and car trouble in winter is a simple but crucial step to take in preparing for the next few months.

PREPARE A WINTER EMERGENCY KIT FOR YOUR VEHICLE. SUPPLIES SHOULD INCLUDE:

- At least two blankets or a sleeping bag
- Flashlight or batterypowered lantern and extra batteries
- Booster (jumper) cables
- Emergency flares
- Extra clothing, particularly boots, hats and mittens
- A steel shovel and rope to use as a lifeline
- Bottled water or juice and nonperishable high-energy foods (granola bars, raisins, nuts, peanut butter or cheese crackers)
- Thermos or container that won't allow liquids to freeze
- First-aid kit and necessary medications

- Sand or non-clumping cat litter for tire traction if your vehicle gets stuck in snow or ice
- A cell phone and charger which can be adapted to vehicle use
- Ice scraper and snow brush
- Tire repair kit and pump
- Candle, matches, heat sticks/ packs, lighters, hand-warmers, etc. (Be sure to crack the window if you using a heat source inside the vehicle)
- Lock your vehicle, even in bad weather. If locks freeze, heat the key. Do not pour hot water on the locks – they will refreeze.

BEFORE LEAVING HOME:

- Find out about the driving conditions and pay attention to weather reports on the radio.
- Remove any snow on your vehicle's windows, lights, brake lights and signals.
- Check your vehicle's tires, wiper blades, fluids, lights, belts and hoses.
- Let someone know your destination, route and expected time of arrival.
- Become familiar with your vehicle's winter weather operating characteristics. Front-wheeldrive vehicles generally handle better than rear-wheel vehicles on slippery roads because the weight of the engine is on the drive wheels, improving traction.

Winter Safety Tips

Winter storms and cold temperatures can be dangerous. Stay safe and healthy by planning. Prepare your home and cars. Prepare for power outages and outdoor activity. Check on older adults. Although winter comes as

no surprise, many of us are not ready for its arrival. Be prepared for the hazards of winter, you are more likely to stay safe and healthy when temperatures start to fall. Be prepared for weather-related emergencies, including power outages.

- Stock food that needs no cooking or refrigeration and water stored in clean containers.
- Ensure that your cell phone is fully charged.
- When planning travel, be aware of current and forecast weather conditions.
- Keep an up-to-date emergency kit, including:
 - Battery-operated devices, such as a flashlight, a National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Weather Radio, and lamps
 - Extra batteries
 - First-aid kit and extra medicine
 - Baby items; and
 - Cat litter or sand for icy walkways.
- Protect your family from carbon monoxide
 - Keep grills, camp stoves, and generators out of the house, basement and garage.
 - Locate generators at least 20 feet from the house.
 - Leave your home immediately if the CO detector sounds, and call 911.

I JUST WANT TO REPLACE THE EXISTING FENCE THAT I HAD, DO I NEED A ZONING PERMIT?

- Yes. A zoning permit is required even when replacing the same type of fence and in the same location. The reason is because a fence previously allowed may be affected by new rules adopted subsequently.
- Aerial images are helpful to compare conditions from prior years to determine when and where a fence was installed.
- Please verify that your fence installer is aware of the applicable



zoning regulations. Fine print in fence contracts may place permitting responsibilies on the owner.

• While this fact sheet is about fences, remember zoning permits are needed for other things as well like new businesses, pools, decks, sheds and additions!

HOW DO I APPLY FOR A FENCE PERMIT?

- Please call (513) 248-3731 and a Miami Township staff member would be happy to provide assistance!
- To apply for a fence in Miami Township:
 - Fill out an application at MiamiTwpOH.gov/zoning.
 - Provide a site-plan using an aerial image. Sharpie in where the fence will be located.
 - Provide a picture example of the proposed fence.
 - Provide a fee of \$50, checks made out to Miami Township. Cash and credit cards are accepted also.





WHERE CAN I INSTALL A FENCE? WHAT ARE THE BASICS?

- For most lots, fences in residential zoning districts generally are allowed only in the side and rear yard areas, with a maximum height of six feet.
- Privacy fences must be installed with the finished side of the fence facing outward.
- The entire length of fence must be of uniform height, the same fence type and made of the same materials.
- In most cases, fences can run along a property line (except for corner lots).



WHAT IS THE FINISHED SIDE OF A KENTUCKY THREE OR FOUR BOARD FENCE?

• The finished side of a Kentucky Board type fence is the side containing a vertical board covering the horizontal boards, aligned with the post.

The finished side of the fence faces your neighbor. The side with the posts faces your property.

• Please verify that your fence contractor is aware of the applicable zoning regulations.

PRIVACY FENCE BASICS

The finished portion of the privacy fence **must** face outwards (towards your neighbor).

- The max height is six feet tall.
- Privacy fences are not permitted in the front yard.
- Privacy fences are not permitted in the corner side yard of a corner lot.
- The entire length of fence must be of uniform height, the same fence type and made of the same materials.

WHAT IS THE FINISHED SIDE OF A PRIVACY FENCE?

- The finished or smooth side of the privacy fence must face towards your neighbor. If you want the finished side on your side of the fence, consider a two-sided fence.
- Please verify that your fence contractor is aware of the applicable zoning regulations.

WHERE CAN I INSTALL A FENCE ON A CORNER LOT? WHAT ARE THE BASICS?

• If interested in installing a fence on a corner lot, please first call the Miami Township Community Development Department at (513) 248-3731. We are happy to review your lot and assist with finding a solution.

MIAMI TOWNSHIP ZONING RESOLUTION AND PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE

- To review the regulations applicable to most residential fences, check out Section 5.08k of the Miami Township Zoning Resolution.
- Fences are required to be maintained in good condition. This is regulated under the Miami Township Property Maintenance Code.
