Low Cost Microchipping Event

The Miami Township Police Department has teamed up with Clermont Animal CARE Humane Society - who runs the Clermont County animal shelter located in Batavia, to provide a low-cost microchipping event! Vet clinics often charge \$60+; however, Clermont Animal CARE Humane Society will be offering this service for only \$25 per pet! Cats are also welcome! This event is open to non-residents as well! Microchipping your pet is the most effective way to ensure your friend isn't away from home for long. The microchips are permanent identification that won't get caught and torn off on branches, etc. The chip is about the size of a grain of rice and it is injected under your pets' skin. It contains a code that is read by a handheld scanner that animal shelters, vet clinics and the Miami Township Police Department have access to. A special database matches the

Beware of Scams This Tax Season

With tax season upon us, this is a time when criminals have become more aggressive in trying to compromise individual's personal information for monetary gain. Individuals, posing as IRS agents, are calling random phone numbers informing victims that there are current criminal charges pending against them due to an unpaid tax bill or that their social security

number has been suspended. The victim is informed that unless payment is made to remedy this situation, a warrant will be filed for their arrest or their social security number will remain locked. The victim is then usually instructed to purchase some type of gift card or prepaid credit card from a business and provide the card numbers to the IRS employee over the phone or to provide their personal credit card information. This, of course, is a scam. The IRS would never call an individual over the phone requesting payment for an outstanding tax obligation. Anyone receiving such a call should hang up immediately. If there is any question or concern about a tax issue, the resident should contact their local IRS agency.

In fact, any call that a resident receives where the caller is requesting payment to be made for some unpaid bill or penalty and where the means of payment being requested is a gift card, prepaid bank card, or the actual resident's banking information, should be ignored. If there is any question as

to the validity of the call, the resident should ask the caller to provide written documentation via mail as to the reason for the call and the remedy being requested. The resident can then call the institution directly after locating a proper phone number themselves to determine if the call was originating from the institution in question.

Every tax season also poses a threat of individuals filing fraudulent tax returns using a victim's personal information. This usually occurs when the victim's personal information was obtained through some type of hacking event. To help avoid such situations, it is important to file your tax returns as soon as possible. You should also check your credit report at least annually. This will alert you to any financial activity that may be taking place under your identity that you did not authorize. All credit reporting agencies are required to provide you a copy of your credit report free of charge at least once a year at your request. A request can be made at www.annualcreditreport.com. Always be cautious when providing any personal information over the phone, especially social security numbers, bank account information, or credit card information to any suspicious or unknown caller. Also, make a habit of staying informed via your credit report which will help you flag suspicious activity relating to your personal information more quickly. If you follow these simple steps, you can help avoid potentially damaging and costly situations relating to your financial health. And as always, if you have any question or concerns, you can contact the police department and ask to speak with a police officer who will address your concerns.

Meet Geremy B. Grooms, Investigations

(Q) What did you do before coming to Miami Township?

(A) In 2002, at age 23, I decided to go for my dream job and applied for and was accepted into the police academy. I worked the next 14 years in patrol at Union Township Police Department where I was a Field Training Officer and a member of the Clermont County Special Response team for several years. In the fall of 2016, I was hired at Miami Township where I worked nightshift patrol until now.

(Q) How did you prepare yourself to in the Investigations Division as a detective?

(A) It has always been a goal of mine to work in investigations. Very early in my career I sought out and obtained specialized training and education that would lead to better understanding and knowledge in this area. I requested additional responsibilities such as conducting background investigations and interviews to gain more experience. I have a lot of experience working with investigations divisions and have established collaborative relationships with many partnering agencies. My 18 years on the road has been invaluable in the preparation process as well.



(Q) What do you do when not at work?

(A) I have three daughters ages 12, 14, and 16 that keep my wife of almost 22 years and I busy year round. When we aren't at a soccer or track field or basketball gym, we enjoy spending our time outdoors. We like to hike, camp, kayak, and hunt as much as our free time allows. If the weather isn't cooperating, you can find me in the garage restoring antique Harley Davidson motorcycles.

(Q) What are three things most do not know about you?

(A) I'm left handed, but bat right. I have a freakish ability to remember people and names. My first tattoo was in Sturgis from a giant guy named Tiny.

Residential Knox Box Program

Did you know that there is a way for the fire department to gain access into your home during an emergency without having to damage your door or windows? What if you were unable to get to the door to let responders in to assist you? Fortunately, Miami Township Fire & EMS participates in a nationwide program called the Knox HomeBox. This small key vault attaches securely to your home or hangs on your door and can only be opened by emergency responders from Miami Township.

Here is how it works. The small key vault is identified in our computer-aided dispatch system

as being present at your address. Our responders know before they arrive at your home that they can gain access to your home

The only people that have access to the Knox Key System in all of our vehicles are trained responders with a special code. These keys cannot be released without that code and the lockbox tracks every time the key is released so we can audit the use of these boxes. Additionally, these keys are only able to be used in Miami Township. Your Knox HomeBox will only be coded to this same key, which ensures maximum safety of your house key inside. The Knox HomeBox is available in a variety of colors and cost \$187 per HomeBox, which can pay for itself in place of having to break a door or window to gain access into the home.

Land Use Plan Update Continues Through 2020

In the Winter 2019 edition of Inside Miami Township, we reported that the update of the Miami Land Use Plan was starting. Here is what is going on now.

In January 2020, the first meeting of the Land Use Plan Update Steering Committee occurred. The Committee engaged in break-out groups that brainstormed to identify the challenges and opportunities relative to growth and land use expected in Miami Township


over the next ten years. Groups noted key community assets to leverage such as the Little Miami Scenic Trail and potential redevelopment areas. Some challenges identified included rejuvenating portions of Route 28

and understanding future housing demands.

In February, staff met with planning consultant Jay Stewart to prepare for the next meeting of the Land Use Plan Update Steering Committee. That meeting will take place on March 31, 2020 at the Miami Township Civic Center. We anticipate that the committee will take a detailed look at planning for certain corridors and focus areas within the Township. Staff is also working on creating an updated current land use map as a baseline of existing conditions, and a draft has been completed.

How can you participate in this important community update? There will be a variety of forums for public input upcoming, but one of the easiest ways to see what is going on and to provide feedback is through the check the "Land

2020 Resurfacing Program

This year Miami Township is getting ready for the biggest resurfacing program in our history. With the passage of the road levy in 2018, the Township now has a larger Road District Fund with which to perform resurfacing projects on our roadways. With the additional funds the levy made available in 2019 we were able to repave 8.7 miles of road in our Township (twice as many as our typical pre-levy funding would allow). This summer, with some carryover from last year, increased funds from the new gas tax disbursement reformulation and the Township Road District Fund we have a project out to bid that will repave approximately 11.4 miles of Township roadways (we currently have over 157 miles of road to maintain). The exact street list will not be available until we receive the bids and the project is awarded by the Board of Trustees. The work will be scheduled to occur when school is out to avoid conflicts with bus traffic. When we have awarded this project and have a final street list, we

will publish it on our website and social media!

CLEAN UP DAYS April 24 & 25

The Service Department will have several trash dumpsters brought to the Civic Center parking lot for residents to drop off damaged or unwanted household goods on Friday, APR 24 (2-6:00 pm) and Saturday, APR 25 (7:30 am - 5 pm). This would include furniture, toys, bikes, grills, concrete blocks, building or landscaping lumber, appliances, etc.

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED include yard clippings, leaves, tires, wet paint, anti-freeze, or any hazardous materials. We will also offer an on-site paper shredding service and disposal of motor oil and lead batteries (alkaline and lithium batteries will not be accepted).



Miami Township no longer collects matresses/box springs unless they are wrapped in plastic and sealed with tape.

PLEASE REMEMBER: Paper shredding will be available on Saturday, APR 25 only and at it's new location at 5900 McPicken Dr.

Proof of residency in Miami Township is needed at the time of drop off. For additional information, please contact the Service Department at 248-3728.

Recycling Do's & Don'ts

Many residents utilize the recycling dumpsters placed throughout the Township. Please help us to maximize the benefit of this program and reduce the amount of material sent to the landfill.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR RECYCLING

- Glass Bottles & Jars (all colors)
- Metal Cans: Aluminum cans, steel cans and lids, empty aerosol cans with the lids and tips removed
- Plastic Bottles (empty, crush, reattach lid): Bottles and jugs that have a small mouth and wider base, such as milk jugs, soda bottles, laundry detergent bottles, water bottles, shampoo bottles and contact solution bottles
- Paper: newspaper, magazines, cardboard, mixed office paper and envelopes, paperboard (cereal boxes), pizza boxes free of food debris and grease, telephone books and catalogs
- Cartons: food and beverage cartons, such as milk, juice, soup, wine, broth and other cartons

RECYCLING TIPS

- Mix all items together no separation required
- Empty all bottles, jugs and cans
- No need to remove labels
- For plastic bottles, empty, crush and reattach lids
- For cartons, remove plastic caps and straws
- **NEVER** place medical sharps or needles in the recycling
- **DON'T** use plastic bags

NOT FOR RECYCLING

No plastic bags, cassette tapes, bed sheets, hangers, metal chains, garden hoses, batteries, needles, syringes, electronics, polystyrene foam, buckets, butter tubs, car parts, food, yard waste, light bulbs, drinking glasses, ceramics, pots, pans, or scrap metal.
