## Street Pavement Condition Re-Evaluation



The Township will once again be utilizing Stantec Engineering and its high tech equipment to scan and record the asphalt, curbs, and gutters on every street in the Township. The results will be placed into a database by several categories to compare conditions. This data

is then used to prioritize streets for the repaying program, and it can be used with county water and sewer projects and private utilities to coordinate future utility replacement projects.

A 2018 report by Stantec Engineering, funded by the Township, revealed more than 40% of Township streets were rated in poor condition and in need of paving. With support from the community and the passage of the 1 mil street repaving levy in 2018, the Township has been able to consistently repair several miles of additional streets annually. However, each year we receive requests from residents and homeowner associations for dozens of streets in the Township to be repaved.

Miami Township is responsible for the maintenance of 156 miles of streets within our community Unfortunately, the number of streets that need to be paved or maintenanced is greater than the amount of funds available for paving each fiscal year.

One rating provided to the Township is the 'Pavement Quality Index' which rates every street on a scale of 1-100, with 100 being the best pavement quality. Having



this objective and measurable data to determine the true condition of each street in the Township allows us to better manage paving and prioritize projects in an equitable manner to maximize the repaving budget.

Thank you, residents for your support and your participation in your local government. An engaged citizen makes for a stronger comunity.

Once complete, the full Pavement Condition Report, and searchable database of Township streets and their conditions, will be made available online at MiamiTwpOH.gov.

### Under-Speed, Utility Vehicles or Mini-Trucks on Township Streets

Effective June 17, 2021 golf carts will be legal to drive on Miami Township streets with a speed limit of 25 MPH or less.

The golf cart:

- Must be inspected, licensed and operated by a licensed driver who is at least 16 years old with insurance.
- Must pass the street legal inspection performed by Miami Township Officers by appointment 513-248-3721.
- After successful inspection, apply for a license plate.
- Cannot be driven on roads greater than 25 MPH.
- Obey all traffic laws.

Equipment needed to be street legal and pass inspection via Ohio BMV form 1373:

- Brakes
- Proper steering mechanism
- 2 brake lights
- Windshield
- 2 headlights
- · Rearview Mirror
- 2 tail lights
- Tires in safe operating condition
- · Directional turn signals

If the above is not accomplished, the golf cart is not legal to be operated on Miami Township streets. Unlicensed drivers are not allowed to operate these vehicles at all. The operation of other vehicles such as unlicensed motorcycles, minibikes, etc. is illegal. Many kids have been warned to not operate these various vehicles on the roadway, not because we want to ruin their goodtime, but because its dangerous!

# Miami Township PD Working Undivided

In 2020, Chief Mike Mills of the Miami Township Police Department and Chief Jamey Mills of the Milford Police Department received an e-mail from a concerned citizen. The e-mail came shortly after the extremely controversial death of George Floyd, who died while being restrained by police in

Minneapolis, MN. Achmed Beighle, author of the e-mail and resident of Miami Township, wanted to know what the police in Miami Township and the City of Milford were doing to protect his family and the Black community. The two police Chiefs would later meet Mr. Beighle for lunch where Mr. Beighle pitched the idea of "Working Undivided."

Working Undivided is a training program established in 2015 by Crossroads Church in Cincinnati. The goal of the program is to help the participants pursue solidarity and close racial divides. The program has several models. The model the Miami Township Police Department participated in was designed for non-faith institutions. The participants in the training met one evening a week for two hours for six straight weeks. Included in the training were Miami Township Police Chief Mike Mills, Miami Township Administrator Jeff Wright, eight Miami Township Police supervisors, Milford Police Chief Jamey Mills, and eight Black members of the community from Miami Township and the City of Milford.

Before the program started, the participants were advised they would be offended at some point during the training. During those six weeks, participants shared their personal stories, feelings, emotions, and opinions on topics involving the racial divide in our country. At times, the conversations would be uncomfortable, but sharing the stories and opinions would help the participants understand one another. Listening to others stories and insight on topics gave the participants a new perspective of what the police and the Black community face on a daily basis. These conversations would more than likely never have happened if it wasn't for the Working Undivided

program. Two quotes from Emmanuel Acho during his "Uncomfortable Conversations with a Black Man" production resonated with the cohort. The first quote was, "Proximity breeds care and distance breeds fear." Approximately two percent of the population in Miami Township is Black. This program helped the officers at Miami Township understand the fears and concerns Black members of the community may experience when involved with the police. The program also helped the members of the Black community understand the immense pressure and dangers a police officer faces on a daily basis. The second quote was, "An ounce of prevention is better than a pound of cure." The Miami Township Police Department is the first police department to ever participate in the Working Undivided program and is committed to making every member of our community feel safe.





At the end of the program, each individual was asked what he or she will do to promote change. What started as a group of guarded strangers meeting for the first time, ended with a group that was undivided, full of optimism, and looking to make a difference in the community.

## Substance Abuse and Mental Health Resources

As police officers, a lot of our time is spent assisting individuals with substance abuse disorders and mental health disorders. Statistically, about one in five people suffer from mental illness and only about half of those are currently in treatment. Similarly, about one in ten people suffer from a drug addiction and only about 10% of those are currently in treatment. Often police are called to intervene with those who have an

untreated mental illness or substance abuse disorder. Miami Township has partnered with the Clermont County Mobile Crisis Team to have mental health professionals accompany our officers to de-escalate mental health crises, assist officers with getting individuals needed mental health treatment at the hospital, and help connect them to local resources for ongoing care. Miami Township also participates in MMART (Milford-Miami Township Addiction Response Team), which pairs an officer, a paramedic, a mental health provider, and a substance abuse recovery coach to help get individuals connected to drug treatment.



In and around Miami Township, we are lucky to have several treatment options which include: Lifestance Health, Clearview Community Counseling, Katkin and Associates, Sunrise Treatment Center, Pinnacle Treatment Center, R.U. Recovery Program, Teen Challenge, and Greater Cincinnati Behavioral Health. \*Contact numbers listed below.

Here are some indicators that you or your loved ones could benefit from substance abuse treatment: you rely on drugs or alcohol to cope with life stressors, you don't feel "normal" without using substances, you are suffering from withdrawals, you have interactions with the police or court system due to using drugs or alcohol, and your drug or alcohol use is negatively impacting your relationships with others or your employment. Here are some indicators that you or your loved ones could benefit from mental health treatment: your mental health is preventing you from actively participating in relationships with others, you struggle with motivation and productivity, you have trouble sleeping or sleep too much, you isolate yourself from others, you experience suicidal thoughts, you see or hear things that others do not, excessive worry, and racing thoughts. These indicators are not a comprehensive list, so if you have any questions you can call the Clermont County Crisis Hotline listed below.

If you are ready to seek treatment, we encourage you to call one of the resources previously listed. If you are concerned about a friend or family member that is suffering from a mental illness or drug addiction, the **Clermont County Crisis Hotline (528-SAVE)** has licensed mental health professionals available 24/7 to offer suggestions, support, and referrals.

As weather has warmed up, paddlers from across Miami Township have taken advantage of canoeing, kayaking, and paddleboarding in search of exploration and adventure.

#### **BEFORE YOU GO**

- Never go out on the water alone.
- Have a Float Plan and let others know where you are going
- Check the weather and water temperature.
- Be a swimmer.
- Prepare to get wet. Have a water tight bag or case to keep your phone safe and available.
- Avoid alcohol and check medications that can impair judgement and reaction time.
- Have a way to contact 911 in case of emergency.

Miami Township borders over 14 miles of the Little Miami River and the Little Miami East Fork River

#### WEAR A LIFE JACKET

- Verify the life jacket fits before entering the water. If a jacket rides up over the wearer's head, look for an alternative fit or style.
- A properly fitted life jacket should be snug, secure, and yet comfortable to encourage its wear.
- Wearing those lifejackets will ensure everyone in your crew is able to enjoy a fun, worry-free day on the water.
- \*85% of fatal canoe and \*48% of fatal kayak accidents involve people not wearing a life jacket.



#### KNOW YOUR SKILL LEVEL

- If the water looks too hazardous to swim, then don't boat on it! Even calm water poses risks.
- Recognize hazards. For instance, 'strainers' are trees and tree branches that are across the river that can trap a paddler and the boat.

## **Backyard Summer Fires**

Many residents' summer fun may involve a small backyard fire or what we in the fire service call a "recreational fire." These fires can certainly add to the enjoyment of outdoor activities, but like most other things, there are some simple rules that need to be followed:


The fires must be small, typically no larger than 3 feet long, 3 feet wide and 3 feet tall. The fuel for these fires must only be small twigs or branches and seasoned

fire wood. You are not permitted to burn items such as leaves, treated lumber, furniture, railroad ties, tires or any other items that would normally be considered trash. When these items are burned they generate large amounts of thick toxic smoke which is never good for outdoor enjoyment and will most likely result in a call for extinguishment.

While the fire is burning it must also be attended continuously by an adult; all children must be supervised and there must be some effective means to extinguish the fire if there should be an immediate need to do so. A garden hose that is close by and already turned on is usually the most convenient and effective method. Children should be watched very carefully if they are making smores or any other food for that matter. Believe it or not, a hot marshmallow that touches the skin for just an instant can result in a severe burn.

Occasionally the fire department is called to an "open burn" call. This means that someone has seen the fire and has concerns about it. Miami Township Fire & EMS will respond to these types of calls without using emergency lights or sirens. We will investigate the fire so make sure it meets all the requirements mentioned earlier. If there is no issue then we will typically leave without further action. If we determine the fire does not meet the requirements or has become a nuisance fire, we may require that it be extinguished. By following these simple steps your backyard fire will be part of your family's fondly remembered events.

# **United Dairy Farmers Reinvests in Miami Township**

Did you know that Miami Township has four United Dairy Farmer stores within our jurisdiction? They can be found on US Route 50 in the southern part of the Township, at the corner of Wolfpen Pleasant Hill Road and State Route 131 in the south central area, on Wards Corner Road near I-275 in the Township's northern area, and at the corner of Loveland Miamiville Road and Branch Hill Guinea Pike,

now, UDF is completing renovations to the Loveland Miamiville Road - Branch Hill Guinea Pike store. The remodeling includes exterior renovations and a redesigned interior. Modifications to the carwash located on the lot are planned as well.

North of the UDF located at Wolfpen Pleasant HIII Road and State Route 131 is, until recently, a vacant

7.88 acre parcel. Interestingly, the property is accessed by two dead-end public streets, Lee Lavati Court and Umrit Court that were constructed many years ago, but no development ever occurred. Recently, however, this tract known as the Wolfpen Commercial Subdivision was acquired by United Dairy Farmers and is currently undergoing modifications to the lot configuration. The subdivision was first created in 2003, and

although full development potential of all the lots is not known, UDF has started construction of a brand new building just south of Umrit Court.

UDF selected Miami Township for one of its first new "Commercial" prototype stores. The store being built at Wolfpen Pleasant Hill Road at Umrit Court will have modern architecture, several outdoor seating areas and around 6,300 square feet of floor space. Access to the new store will be easier also. Customers at the current store may have experienced challenges during certain times

of the day when entering or leaving the parking lot. The new location provides for access from Wolfpen Pleasant Hill Road, Umrit Court, and from State Route 131 via Lee Lavati Court. Once the store is completed, drivers may notice new traffic patterns and more people walking in the area. After the move, the current store will be demolished and replaced with landscaping.

Miami Township is excited to announce the return of Clean Up Days on Friday, SEPT 17 (2-6:00 PM) and Saturday, SEPT 18 (7:30 AM - 5:00 PM). We appreciate our resident's patience getting this service back online and in order with state mandated safety protocols!

The Service Department will have several trash dumpsters brought to the Civic Center parking lot located at 6101 Meijer Drive, for residents to drop off damaged or unwanted household goods. This includes furniture, toys, bikes, grills, concrete blocks, building or landscaping lumber, appliances, etc. Items NOT accepted include yard clippings, leaves, wet paint, anti-freeze, or any other hazardous materials. Mattresses and/or box springs MUST be wrapped in plastic and sealed with tape.

We will also offer an on-site paper shredding service. Paper shredding will be available on Saturday only. In April, this popular service yielded 27,000 pounds of recyclable paper. Paper shredding takes place at the Safety Services Training Center located next to the salt dome off Meijer Drive.
