The Miami Township Police 'Shop with a Cop' event continues to exceed all expectations with the 2020 event being the most successful yet. Our holiday event in 2020 saw 131 youngsters shopping with first responders to find the perfect gifts for their family members and something for themselves. Families were invited to check out the large selection of new and donated coats that were given away at no cost.





Cold Weather Seasonal Safety Tips

As the winter months come upon us, many of us have already had to fire up our furnace for the year and others are starting to pull out the space heaters for some added warmth. The members of Miami Township Fire & EMS want to make sure you remember some key fire safety points as we head into the coldest months of the year.

HEATING

Heating is the second leading cause of US home fires and home fire injuries and third leading cause of home fire deaths. December, January, and February are the peak months for heating fires. Space heaters are the type of equipment most often involved in home heating equipment fires, accounting for more than two of every five fires (44%), as well as the vast majority of deaths and injuries in home fires caused by heating equipment. Remember to look for the "UL" (Underwriter's Laboratory) label on all heating devices and if they do not appear to be working correctly, dispose of them immediately. Also, make sure to have your furnace or home heating unit inspected and serviced annually to ensure it is working properly.

CARBON MONOXIDE

Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide (CO) is an odorless, colorless gas created when fuels such as gasoline, wood, coal, propane, etc. do not burn completely. In the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel are potential sources of CO. Carbon monoxide incidents are more common during the winter months, and in residential properties. Make sure you have CO detectors installed in your home, especially near sleeping areas. If they are battery operated, check the batteries monthly.

WINTER STORMS

Most of the U.S. is at risk for winter storms, which can cause dangerous and sometimes life-threatening conditions. Blinding wind-driven snow, extreme cold, icy road conditions, downed trees and power lines can all wreak havoc on our daily schedules. Be careful if you need to travel out when storms are predicted and always have an emergency kit in your vehicle in case you become stranded and need to wait for assistance.

GENERATORS

Portable generators are useful during power outages, however, many homeowners are unaware that the improper use of portable generators can be risky. The most common dangers associated with portable generators are carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning, electrical shock or electrocution, and fire hazards. According to a 2013 Consumer Product Safety Commission report, half of the generator-related deaths happened in the four coldest months of the year, November through February, and portable generators were involved in the majority of carbon monoxide deaths involving engine-driven tools. Keep generators outside and away from windows and doors. If you choose to have a generator installed, be sure it is done by a certified electrician.

CANDLES

December is the peak time of year for home candle fires; the top two days for home candle fires are Christmas and Christmas Eve. Each year between 2013-2017, an average of 7,900 home candle fires were reported each year. Consider switching to battery operated candles this season.

ELECTRICAL

Electrical home fires are a leading cause of home fires in the U.S. Roughly half of all home electrical fires involved electrical distribution or lighting equipment, while nearly another half involved other known types of equipment like washer or dryer fans, and portable or stationary space heaters. Remember to unplug battery chargers when they are not in use and periodically check devices that are being charged to ensure they are not overheating.

SMOKE DETECTORS

When you changed your clock for daylight savings time, you should have checked the batteries in your smoke detector, but do you know how old your smoke detector is? If it is over ten years old, it no longer works as effectively as it should and is probably past its normal operating lifespan. Consider replacing your old detectors with new ones this winter and give the gift of safety to your family. Census Data Shows Positive Growth for Miami Township

Information from the 2020 Census shows positive community growth for Miami Township, at a "just right" rate. Information compiled by *Cincinnati.com* (the Cincinnati Enquirer website) shows that from 2010 to 2020 the Township's population grew from 40,848 to 43,943 – 7.6%. Clermont County overall grew from 197,375 to 208,601 – 5.7%.

By comparison, some of the other larger townships in the county also experienced net positive inflow, including Batavia Township at 18.8% and Union Township at 6.9%.

Clermont County staff informed us that

Miami Township was the only township to independently participate in the Census Bureau's Local Update of Census Addresses program, also known as LUCA. LUCA is a decennial



census partnership program that allows designated representatives of tribal, state, and local governments to review and update the Census Bureau's Address List that is used to deliver questionnaires for the decennial census. Its common that the census bureau information can be several years behind in identifying new roads that a community may have added, for example, through new subdivision development. Participating in LUCA helps ensure all new residents are accounted for.

The moderate growth over the decade of 7.6% is a healthy indicator for community conditions and of the desirability of Miami Township. Population growth, income growth, and housing price growth are all measures of an area's success. Growth might not seem important, but for townships they are either growing or shrinking, and the latter can create more problems.

LAND USE PLAN UPDATE COMMITTEE - Work Continues
