## **Notable Successes in 2022**



The Township has seen many notable successes in 2022, but two stand out; the private purchase of the Cincinnati Technology Campus on Tri Ridge Boulevard at Wards Corner Road

(formerly International Paper) and the Township's ability to secure available grant funds.

The purchase of the Cincinnati Technology Campus by local developer, Rob Smyjunas will bring new employers to the site and add 49 rental townhomes. One of those employers is Cold Jet. The company plans to consolidate its two current locations - one in Miami Township and one in Union Township, by renovating space for a new facility on Tri-Ridge Boulevard. They will also be adding 67 jobs over the next three years (currently 120), generating \$5 million in new payroll. Cold Jet's \$5 million capital investment and new jobs helps diversify the Township's tax base.

Over the past several years, the Township has been very aggressive in competing for available grants to offset costs of capital items and construction projects. In 2022, the Township has been awarded nearly \$1 millon. These grants include:

<u>Bureau of Workers Compensation</u> (BWC) for equipment in both Police and Fire & EMS operations <u>Ohio Public Works Commission</u> (OPWC) for road stabilization on Redbird and Dry Run - covering 79% of the cost for each project

<u>Community Development Block Grant</u> for curb, gutter and sidewalk improvements on Business 28 <u>Clermont County Park District</u> for smaller improvements at our parks including pickleball courts

## Citizens Police Academy Graduates 27th Class

The MTPD graduated 13 citizens from the 2022 Citizens Police Academy. This is the 27<sup>th</sup> class to graduate from the Academy since it was established in 1998. To date, over 400 citizens have completed the Academy.

The Citizens Police Academy is a ten week program that meets one evening per week and introduces students to different functions and components of the Police Department.

Upon completion of the Citizens Police Academy, graduates are invited to join the Alumni Association with members from previous academies. The Alumni Association is very active in Miami Township and Clermont County. Many of the events offered by Miami Township are successful due in part to the volunteerism of the Police Academy Alumni.

## Captain Graduates from OFE

Captain Steve Monterosso recently graduated from The Ohio Fire Executive Program.

The Ohio Fire Executive (OFE) program, created and administered by the Ohio Fire & Emergency Services Foundation, is an executive development program. The OFE assesses, enhances, and refines



the leadership qualities of Officers who are currently leading their organizations and develops 'bench strength' in high potential senior officers who can move into positions of greater responsibility. Through the course of the program, students have been impacted on knowledge acquisition, self-awareness building, perspective change, skill development, and behavior change. After 2.5 years of hard work, 180+ hours of in-class time, and 400+ hours of out-of-class time, Captain Monterosso joins the 400+ graduates as Ohio Fire Executive Alumni.

Captain Monterosso has been serving the citizens of Miami Township since 1981 when he began as a cadet with Miami East Fire Department then joined Milford-Miami Township EMS until 1994 when all Fire & EMS Departments were merged into the Miami Township Fire & EMS Department.

### Partnership in 'Experiential Learning'

Miami Township has partnered with Loveland High School to give students a unique opportunity to leave the classroom and experience different career options through experiential learning. Students are able to apply to internship positions, simulating a job interview. They can then go into the workplace to take on new challenges - hands on. This can be beneficial to students and the companies who host them.

Meghan Smith, a senior at Loveland High School, is currently working as a "Multimedia Intern" here at the Township. Through her experience she has been able to learn new skills and put them into practice on a daily basis. She's been given the opportunity to work on editing, photography, marketing, and given a chance to see how planning and multitasking goes into communicating with residents and the public. "As the end of my semester approaches, I have found this experience to be instrumental as I move onto collegiate level learning" says Ms. Smith. "I have found strengths within this job, experiencing many different facets of a career in this field and had the opportunity to close some doors; learning there are some careers I no longer wish to pursue."

Miami Township also benefits. Students provide valuable insight on new ways of engaging a wider audience. Their input helps guide new kinds of interaction (videos, podcasts) and connect with a younger demographic. This kind of learning allows students to pursue a study they are passionate about and gain valuable professional experience while receiving high school credit. It is creating experienced, passionate workers who might even come back to work at the Township or explore a field in public service.

## **Crime Prevention/Community Relations (CPCR)**

agenda as a means to interact with the residents, businesses, and houses of worship to strengthen partnerships and build trust. Let's take a look at some the events that are planned:

Beginning in April of 2023, the CPCR division will be partnering with the Calvary Baptist Church to bring the first-ever **Easter Egg Helicopter Drop** to Miami Township. The event will be on Saturday, April 1, 2023, at Miami Meadows Park.

In May, CPCR will once again join the Miami Township Fire Department for a **Safety Fair**, which is held annually at the parking lot of the Mulberry Kroger store in the heart of Miami Township. Moving into June, CPCR will partner with the Clermont County Animal Shelter for the annual **Pet Microchipping Event** at Miami Meadows Park.

The summer is filled with a variety of camps put on by the Miami Township Recreation Department that are attended by CPCR, such as: **Kindergarten Safety, Big Trucks and Cool Vehicles, and This Is Me.** A complete listing of camps and other Miami Township events is available at *MiamiTwpOH.gov*.Launched in 2021, **H20 with Miami Township 5-0** pop-up events, organized by CPCR in collaboration with members of the Undivided Cohorts, bring fun events targeted at select areas of Miami Township. After the first H2O event

in July of 2021, Officer Staci Miller of CPCR applied for a grant geared towards the H2O events to help them become annual events. The grant was awarded, and in July of 2022 we were able to add a third H2O event and provide Kona Ice with the additional funds.

National Night Out is another annual event that is co-hosted with the City of Milford. National Night Out is held on the first Tuesday of August each year. August is also the time of year that CPCR begins planning and accepting applications for the annual 10-week Citizens Police Academy Class that begins each September.

This year, CPCR pioneered the first ever participation in the Faith & Blue initiative. Faith & Blue is geared toward partnering law enforcement with houses of worship to build bridges and effect positive change within the community. The Miami Township Police Department partnered with three local houses of worship for this pilot program: Epiphany United Methodist Church, Calvary Baptist Church, and Rivertree Church. As a result, the Miami Township Police Department participated in eight events geared toward community interaction, to include: a fall BBQ, Pet Blessing, Mountaintop Ministry service, prayers over officers, and a Trunk or Treat. Additionally, in 2022, CPCR has taken on the role of offering **Response to Active Shooter** training to all businesses and houses of worship within Miami Township. As we move into 2023, more events are likely to be added. Our Miami Township Police Department social media pages

## **CPR & New Technology**

Immediate CPR can double or triple chances of survival after cardiac arrest.

Cardiopulmonary resuscitation - aka CPR, is an emergency lifesaving procedure performed when the heart stops beating. If you've ever gone through a CPR class in the past, you've probably done compressions on a manikin and thought to yourself, "I wonder if I'm doing this right?" or "I wonder if this would even work?". Here is the truth... **QUALITY**MATTERS. For each minute that passes without defibrillation and CPR, the chance of survival from sudden cardiac arrest decreases by 7-10%.

Miami Township Fire & EMS is dedicated to educating everyone who wants to learn how to perform good quality CPR. In our effort to educate everyone, we invested in exciting new technology to better teach people the proper way to do compressions and

potentially save a life. The new QCPR Training Program and manikins provide us, the CPR instructors, and the students, with live and summative feedback on their CPR performance. Furthermore, the QCPR Training App enables the CPR instructor to have an overview of 1-6 manikins per class. This allows us to quickly identify students learning needs and provide tailored instructions based on objective QCPR monitoring. This means you will be able to see on screen whether you're going fast enough, deep enough, and allowing full recoil of the chest to provide the highest quality CPR compressions.



### **Chain of Survival**

By becoming certified in CPR, you become an integral part in the Chain of Survival. The first 3 steps in the chain of survival fall solely on the public, more importantly those certified in CPR. The Chain of survival is as follows.

- Identify Recognition of cardiac arrest and activation of the emergency response system (calling 9-1-1 in the US)
- Early CPR with an emphasis on chest compressions
- Rapid defibrillation
- Advanced resuscitation by Emergency Medical Services and other healthcare providers
- Post-cardiac arrest care
- Recovery (including additional treatment, observation, rehabilitation, and psychological support)

A strong Chain of Survival can improve chances of survival and recovery for victims of cardiac arrest.

### **Great for New Parents, Grand Parents, and Baby-Sitters**

As a parent of two young children, I've found being prepared for anything is essential. That is why at Miami Township Fire & EMS, along with our new adult manikins, we also purchased new infant manikins that provide great feedback when it comes to CPR and choking. The CPR feedback can assure proper hand/finger placement for compressions along with the rate, depth, and recoil of the compressions. In addition to CPR feedback, a bonus feature of the infant manikins is that they have a choking setting that reacts automatically when proper treatment is performed for a choking infant, which includes back blows and compressions.

The manikins will literally start crying on their own when the student does the technique taught in class correctly.



### **Abdominal Thrust for Choking**

Speaking of choking, in another effort to improve our CPR program the Township acquired new adult and child choking simulator that promote proper technique when it comes to Abdominal Thrust - aka the Heimlich Maneuver. These simulators teach proper hand placement and the amount of force necessary to successfully accomplish removal of an airway obstruction. They have a couple levels of difficulty that can really challenge the students and make them better at the skill. When done properly the obstruction goes flying!

## Hike, Bike, Paddle

In September Community Development Department staff attended the initial meeting of the Clermont County Hike, Bike, Paddle Committee, which is being sponsored by the Clermont County Community & Economic Development Department. The purpose of the committee is to discuss and determine improvements to hike, bike and paddle infrastructure within Clermont County, and



planning for future improvements. At the meeting, officials explained that they would like to put together a plan, that will then help the County qualify for future funding that may be available for these activities. With Miami Township containing over five miles of the Little Miami Scenic Trail and fronting along the Little Miami River, as well as concurrently working on our own connections plan as part of the Land Use Plan Update, we are excited to be engaged with this committee.

### **Jimmy Johns Under Construction**

Construction is underway for the new Jimmy Johns sandwich restaurant to be located in a former portion of the Meijer parking lot off of State Route 28. The new building will



be located just west of the existing Waffle House. Both the new Jimmy Johns and the existing Waffle House are making productive use of valuable real estate that was formerly dedicated to a mostly underutilized area of the parking field.

## **Demolition Going Strong**

Demolition is now complete for the former residential structure and former office building located at Happy Hollow Road and Business 28. These two properties are quite visible to eastbound



traffic on State Route 28. The two structures are being removed to make way for the new Optima Dermatology medical office. It is positive to see this re-investment occurring along the Business 28 corridor. We understand the purchase price for the two structures was around \$1.3M.



Community Development staff recently attended an economic development presentation where three expert realtors in different commercial areas gave their take on the current state of affairs in real estate demand in the greater Cincinnati area.

The perspective from the retail expert was that people actually want to go shopping in person, and that retail vacancies are low. When looking at some of Miami Township's retail areas, that seems to be confirmed. The presentation was sponsored by "Alloy" formerly HCDC (Hamilton County Development Corp). Alloy is available to provide SBA loan assistance to businesses located in Miami Township.

## Winter Operations: Snow Route FAQs

It's the Miami Township Service Department's goal to provide timely snow and/or ice removal from Township maintained roads. The Township's 158 miles of roads are divided into 10 snow routes. During the winter months, we receive many questions regarding the work we perform. Here are the most frequently asked questions that we receive:

### WHY DOESN'T THE TOWNSHIP PRE-TREAT ROADS WITH SALT?

Studies have shown that an estimated 80 percent of rock salt is wasted when applied to dry streets. When the rock salt has nothing to adhere to, a large portion of it bounces off the roads. It also tends to be crushed by traffic and then blown off the roads during windy conditions prior to the snow falling.

### WHY DOES IT TAKE SO LONG TO SALT OR PLOW MY ROAD?

Drivers complete their route start to finish in the same order each time roads are treated. If treating with salt only, it takes approximately 4 hours to complete one pass thru the township. It takes nearly double that time to complete one pass when both plowing and salting the roads.

## WHY DOES MY DRIVER ALWAYS BLOCK MY DRIVEWAY WITH SNOW?

When the snow plow truck goes by your driveway, snow may be placed at the end of your driveway. Although frustrating if you've already shoveled your driveway, this is an unavoidable situation since the snow rolls off the plow. We ask that you do not place snow from your driveway and sidewalk into the road when shovelling. Drivers do their best to evenly distribute the snow when clearing cul-de-sacs. Some cul-de-sacs are small and driveways are close together, making it difficult to clear the roads of the snow.

### WHY ARE SOME ROADS TREATED WITH BRINE?

Prior to most predicted winter events the service Department will pre-treat roads with hills and dangerous curves. These roads are treated with a salt brine solution. If it does not rain or snow, the dried brine will typically remain on a road for 3 to 5 days after applied.

### WHY DOESN'T THE SNOW PLOW TRUCK COMPLETELY CLEAR THE ROAD?

During a heavy snow, drivers are instructed to make the roads passable. On the first round of treatment, they will plow in and out once per road. Cut backs, cul-de-sacs, and "wedges" in intersections will be cleared of snow after the first round of plowing. Depending on the surface temperature, a light covering of snow may remain on the roads, but they will be passable. Traffic, sunshine, and rising temperatures are necessary to assist in completely melting the snow away.
