Miami Township Parks Master Planning



In 2024, we had the pleasure of working with The Kleingers Group to do a comprehensive assessment of Miami Township parks. This gave us an opportunity to evaluate the existing conditions of every aspect of each park, from every park bench and picnic table to the athletic fields, shelters and buildings. We were fortunate enough to be able to utilize existing American Recovery Plan Act (ARPA) funds to be able to perform this assessment, without having to use any park levy funds. The information that was gathered from this assessment was extremely beneficial to be able to help us

plan for immediate needs, as well as for future needs and additional opportunities that may be able to be incorporated into each park.

Assessing the current conditions of our Township parks was the first of two planned phases. We also wanted to be able to use the Federal ARPA funds to conduct a master plan for our parks that was assisted by and developed with the information gained from the comprehensive assessment. The park levy that was put on the ballot in November of 2024 was not successful, and we took that as an opportunity to hear from our residents about what they want to see develop with their parks.

The master planning process will be conducted by The Kleingers Group and will involve community input in a few ways. We will be hosting an open house where our residents can come into the Civic Center to view boards for each park that will show current amenities and possible future options for some redevelopment. Secondly, we will have an online survey that our residents can provide feedback and information through. The Kleingers Group will compile the information that is received and will work to help us plan for future park needs so that we can ensure the parks meet the needs of our community.

We are excited to start the master planning process and look forward to hearing from our residents. Please keep an eye on our website at MiamiTwpOH.gov for community feedback opportunities.

Participants will have the opportunity to gain insight into the workings of a police department and experience various aspects of police officer duties. Much of the training is hands-on! Topics include: Police K-9, drones, a jail tour, active shooter response, and a visit from Air Care.

Applicants must be at least 18 years old and agree to a background check. The class size is limited, with priority given to residents of Miami Township. Admission is granted on a first-come, first-served basis.

Voluntary Camera Registration Initiative

The Miami Township Police Department is introducing a Voluntary Camera Registration Program aimed at deterring and swiftly resolving crimes. Residents and local business owners are encouraged to register their cameras. We understand there may be concerns about potential misuse of this initiative, so it is important to understand what this program entails. Participation in this program is voluntary, and registering your camera does not grant the Police Department live video access. Instead, it simply provides investigators with location information to request footage, if needed. This data will only be utilized during criminal investigations or emergencies.



Registering your camera takes less than a minute through our secure online portal—just scan the provided QR Code to get started. Remember, permissions can be modified at any time by the owner. If you do choose to share video evidence, it will become part of the case file; until then, the data remains under the owner’s control.

The Miami Township Police Department is dedicated to fostering partnerships and building trust within the community. This program serves as another resource to ensure we provide you with the exceptional level of service you deserve.

Preventing and Managing Burn Injuries

As we approach warmer weather, many of us look forward to spending time outdoors—whether it’s maintaining our lawns, enjoying a cozy fire pit, or grilling our favorite meals. However, it’s important to remember that these activities involve the use of flammable liquids, which can pose significant burn risks if not handled properly. By being aware of the potential dangers and following a few simple precautions, we can safely enjoy our outdoor activities while minimizing the risk of burn injuries.

UNDERSTANDING THE DANGERS OF FLAMMABLE LIQUIDS

Flammable liquids, such as gasoline, propane, and lighter fluid, are commonly used in lawnmowers, fire pits, and grills. While these liquids are essential for fueling outdoor equipment, they can be dangerous if mishandled. A simple spark, an improperly stored container, or even a small spill can lead to fires that cause severe burns and injuries.

SAFETY TIPS FOR LAWN MOWERS

Lawnmowers are a staple for maintaining a well-kept yard, but they also pose specific risks, particularly when gasoline is involved. Gasoline is highly flammable, and improper handling can lead to serious injuries.

- 1. Refuel Safely:** Always refuel your lawnmower when the engine is cool. Never refuel a hot engine, as gasoline fumes can ignite from the heat.
- 2. Check for Leaks:** Inspect your lawnmower regularly for any signs of fuel leaks. Leaking gasoline can be a major fire hazard. If you find a leak, have it repaired before using the mower again.
- 3. Use Fuel in a Well-Ventilated Area:** When refueling, make sure to do so in an open, well-ventilated area, away from any sources of ignition such as hot surfaces or flames.
- 4. Store Gasoline Properly:** Store gasoline in an approved container, and keep it in a cool, dry place away from heat or open flames. Never store gasoline indoors or near your lawnmower.

SAFETY TIPS FOR FIRE PITS

Fire pits are great for adding warmth and ambiance to a backyard gathering, but they also require careful attention when using flammable liquids to start the fire.

- 1. Avoid Using Gasoline to Start the Fire:** Although gasoline may seem like a quick way to start a fire, it is highly volatile and can cause an uncontrollable blaze. Instead, use fire starter sticks, kindling, or specially designed fire starters.
- 2. Keep Flammable Liquids at a Safe Distance:** Always store gasoline, kerosene, or other flammable liquids at least 10 feet away from the fire pit. Never bring these liquids near the fire to try to boost the flames.
- 3. Supervise the Fire:** Always keep a watchful eye on the fire, and never leave it unattended. Keep children and pets at a safe distance from the fire pit—ideally at least 3 feet away. Have a water hose close by in the event that the fire gets outside the fire pit.
- 4. Extinguish the Fire Properly:** When you’re finished, ensure the fire is fully extinguished. Use water or sand to douse the flames, and make sure no embers are still smoldering before leaving the area.

SAFETY TIPS FOR GRILLS

Grilling is a popular outdoor activity, but it also involves the use of propane or charcoal, which can cause serious burns if mishandled.

- 1. Check for Leaks:** If you use a propane grill, regularly check for leaks in the gas lines or connections. Apply a soapy water solution to the connections; if bubbles form, you have a leak, and the grill should be repaired before use.
- 2. Never Leave the Grill Unattended:** Always stay by the grill while it’s in use. A moment of distraction can lead to a fire or an injury from hot surfaces or flames.

3. Use Long-Handled Tools: When cooking on the grill, always use long-handled utensils to keep your hands a safe distance from the heat. Never reach over the grill to adjust food without proper protection.

4. Keep the Grill Clean: Regularly clean your grill, especially grease buildup. Excess grease can catch fire and cause a dangerous flare-up.

WHAT TO DO IF A BURN INJURY OCCURS

Even with the best precautions, accidents can happen. If you or someone else suffers a burn injury from a flammable liquid, it’s essential to know how to respond quickly.

- 1. Cool the Burn:** If the burn is from a liquid or flame, immediately cool the area with cool (not cold) running water for 3-5 minutes. This helps to reduce the heat and prevent further skin damage.
- 2. Cover the Burn:** After cooling, cover the burn with a clean, dry cloth or sterile dressing to protect the area from infection.
- 3. Seek Medical Help:** For burns that are severe or cover a large area, seek immediate medical attention. Always err on the side of caution, especially if the burn involves the face, hands, or genitals, or if the person experiences difficulty breathing or other severe symptoms.

CONCLUSION

While outdoor activities like lawn mowing, grilling, and enjoying a fire pit can be fun, it’s important to stay vigilant when working with flammable liquids. By following safety precautions—such as refueling equipment carefully, keeping a safe distance from fire pits, and maintaining grills properly—you can prevent burn injuries and enjoy these activities safely.

This season, let’s make safety a priority in our outdoor spaces, ensuring that everyone can enjoy the warmth and joy of the outdoors without the risk of harm. Stay safe, be prepared, and have a great time outdoors!

Pool Gate and Fence Fact Sheet Gets an Update

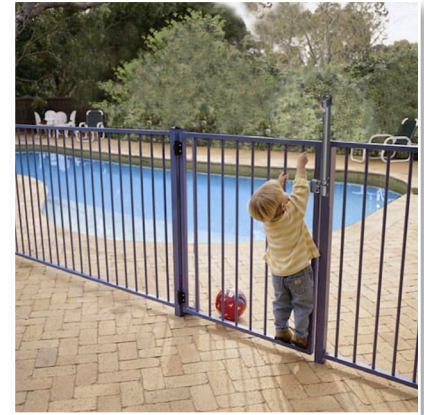

One of our more popular web articles is the Pool Gate and Fence Fact Sheet. The document gives helpful tips and illustrations on how to install the correct safety fencing and latches around swimming pools. Certain pool safety features, such as self-closing and latching gates, and fencing of minimum dimensions is called out under the Miami Township Property Maintenance Code. The Pool Gate and Fence Fact Sheet is provided to all contractors and property owners who install a new swimming pool.

We recently updated the document to improve illustrations and to more easily explain the nuances of required fencing and safety latching for swimming pools. A new pair of eyes by Zoning & Property Maintenance Inspector Steve Mick, with technical assistance from Community Development Co-op Wynn timer Serra, resulted in an improved and refreshed document. Here are some of the top takeaways for swimming pool safety:

- Exterior gate latches must be mounted at least 54" high
- Fences with openings greater than 6" must have mesh applied to the exterior of the fence
- Above ground pools 48" or taller do not need separate fencing, but the pool entry point must be enclosed by a self-closing and latching gate
- Swimming pool covers can provide an extra measure of safety, but do not substitute for required fencing

Whose Road Is It?

One question that the Service Department receives year round, but we hear it more in winter, is ‘who is responsible for maintaining my road?’ Living within a township can make this question more difficult to answer than if you live in a city. Within a city all the roads are maintained

by the city, but within a township the roads are maintained by several municipalities.

Miami Township has roads that are maintained by Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT), Clermont County Engineer’s, Miami Township, and Privately owned roads. If you do not know who maintains your road, it can make contacting the correct department difficult as you can get passed from one department to another. We know that this can be frustrating, so we have a helpful list available on the Miami Township website. On the Service Department home page is a link “Whose Road is It?” This link will take you to a list of roads that are maintained by Clermont County Engineer’s and ODOT. We also have contact information for either of these entities and the Miami Township Service Department.

2025 Resurfacing Project

Miami Township is excited to announce curb and gutter replacement will begin as soon as weather allows. The paving portion will be scheduled for summer when school is not in session. If you have invisible dog fences or sprinkler systems within 2 feet of the back of the curb, you will need to mark their locations. The Township will not be responsible for any damage that occurs to them during the replacement of bad curb sections.

Streets will be posted “no parking” 24 hours in advance of the start of work. You may lose access to your driveway temporarily if the curb in front of your drive apron needs replacement or repair.
