Community Service Award for Outstanding Work



The Miami Township Board of Trustees and Administrator, Steve Kelly presented Shelly Stahl and Paige Craig with Community Service Awards at the June Business Meeting.

This spring, Miami Township had the honor of working along side many

others to host the grave marking of a Revolutionary War Veteran at Union Cemetery, located off Branch Hill Guinea Pike. The ceremony recognized Isaac South,

who purchased 178 acres here in Miami Township in 1817 after moving his family from Middlesex county New Jersey. You can learn more about Isaac South by visiting *MiamiTwpOH.gov* and reading his bio.

The grave marking was a special event for our community and would not have been possible without the volunteer work of Shelly Stahl and chaplain for the local chapter Clough Valley Chapter of the Daughers of the American Revolution, Paige Craig.

Shelly Stahl is a Township resident and has worked tirelessly to clean over 100 headstones in the Union and Mulberry cemeteries in Miami Township. Along the way Shelly uncovered the names and history associated with previously unknown, or recognizable graves. Her work has made new information available to the families of the individuals whose names and history were uncovered. One such individual was Isaac South. Shelly passed this information on to Paige who works with the Clermont County Geneological Society. Paige was able to secure permission for the historical grave marking of Isaac South after months of research to confirm his status as a Revolutionary War Veteran. Paige's research included tax records and proof of military service from the New Jersey state archives. Paige connected with Township staff to begin the months of planning required to pull of the ceremony this spring.



The Board of Trustees thank Shelly and Paige for their outstanding acts of community service, which has uncovered a treasured piece of history for Miami Township. Please let the important work of these two individuals serve as a reminder how much of an impact one act of civil service can achieve. It is our honor to present them with the Community Service Award!

The 2025 "Safest Cities in Ohio" report from SafeWise.com has been released and Miami Township remained the safest community in Ohio with a population over 40,000 residents

Our violent crime rate for the last year was 0.51 per 1,000 people, far under the national violent crime rate of 3.6 per 1,000 people.

Our property crime rate for the last year was 7.25 per 1,000 people, far under the national property crime rate of 19.1 per 1,000 people.



These results are unquestionably the product of a team effort and strong partnership that exists between the Miami Township Police Department and our amazing residents who look out for one another and report suspicious activity.

The effectiveness of Neighborhood Watch Programs has been widely studied, and the results indicate that their success hinges on, among other factors, implementation, community involvement, and the nature of targeted crimes. Beyond that, Neighborhood Watch Programs have evolved into a more technological realm, thanks to HOA social media pages and the increasing use of home security cameras.

To foster proactive community involvement in crime reduction, the Miami Township Police Department and Miami Township Fire & EMS have collaborated to launch an initiative aimed at strengthening connections within neighborhoods and enhancing familiarity with the first responders serving them. Starting in May and continuing through August, our safety services will be visiting our neighborhoods during the evenings. These events

will provide educational materials, information, and opportunities for personal connections. We'll cover topics such as how to register your camera to assist in solving and reducing crime, the advantages of having a Knox Box, and various other subjects to empower our community members in keeping Miami Township one of the safest communities in Ohio for generations to come!

In the role as the first Community Health Coordinator, he has been a visible and widely respected contact for our department. We are grateful to have Firefighter/Paramedic John

Cooper receive the torch from Lieutenant Petry. Up to Jim's retirement, they will work corroboratively to transfer the many duties of this position.

Lieutenant Petry will transition to retirement duties associated with home projects and grandchildren. He will also continue to work in the Mental Health field, frequently with first responders, having obtained his master's degree in counseling. We are confident that Jim will continue to visit his second home at Miami Township Fire & EMS, continuing to support and guide our personnel even after retirement.

The Township will begin to see Community Health Coordinator Cooper at community events and out visiting members in need of the Fire & EMS Department's services. New Zoning Notification HUB Live Now

Check out the new Public Notice Hub which is now live on the Miami Township website. Notifications for all Zoning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals hearings can now be found in one convenient location. It's a great way to keep an eye on cases that you may find interesting, including notifications of dates and times of public hearings, as well as decision letters.

Until recently, zoning hearing notifications were subject to inflexible newspaper filing deadlines and limited publication schedules. Notification of zoning hearings had to be posted to "newspapers" of general circulation, which in Miami Township meant only two newspapers, which could be very expensive.

Hearing scheduling had to work around limited filing deadlines, infrequent notification windows and high costs. Now, thanks to recent state legislation, Ohio House Bill 315 which went into effect on April 2, 2025, as well as action by the Miami Township Board of Trustees, notification may instead be published on the Township website. This eliminates the publication costs altogether and provides additional flexibility to scheduling.



More importantly, there is now a simple and easily

accessed "go to" location for all zoning notifications and hearings. Check it out online!

Brush Vouchers

Miami Township residents can drop off tree limbs and brush at Bzak Landscaping year-round. Bzak Landscaping is located at 931 Round Bottom Rd. They will accept all limbs and brush

and brush from Miami Township residents at no charge who present a free voucher. The



vouchers are available at the Miami Township Civic Center, or at the Miami Township Police Department between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00 pm, Monday-Friday.

Proof of residency is required to obtain a voucher. One voucher is required per load. There is no limit to the amount of vouchers issued per resident. Please contact the Service Department at (513) 248-3728 with any questions.

Field Status Hotline

To check the status of athletic fields at Township parks, call the Field Condition Hotline at (513) 248-5513. It is important to not play on the fields when they are closed. This will help to eliminate extensive maintenance to damaged fields. Also, the Township does not allow non-employees to maintain ball diamonds. This includes raking and the application of material to assist in the drying of fields.
