Safety Services Levy Info

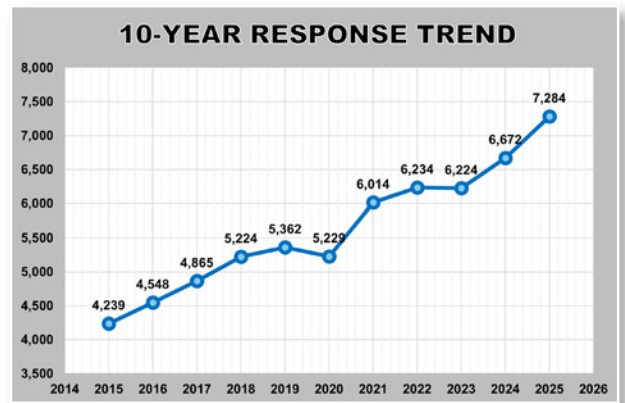
In January, the Miami Township Trustees voted unanimously to put a 3.1 mil safety services levy on the ballot for voters to consider on May 5, 2026 that would support both our Police and Fire & EMS departments. The decision was made after the unanimous recommendation of a seven-member Community Action Team made up of residents who evaluated the future of safety services in the Township and the projected finances associated with providing those services to residents. Their recommendation

came from a position of trying to extend the life of the current Safety Service Fund to respect the fact that voters are concerned about the current state of property taxes but still wish to receive the types of and current level of safety and security that they have come to expect from our Township's safety forces.

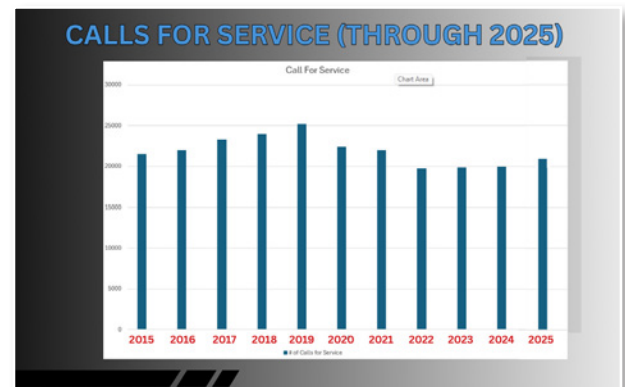
Additionally, the Township conducted a Township-wide survey, held two town halls, and numerous other community engagement meetings to garner input from residents and gauge their thoughts and opinions regarding the state of safety services in the Township. All the efforts undertaken by the Township resulted in a message back that residents were happy with the safety services being provided to them, and they did not want to see the current level of service change.

The current safety services levy has lasted much longer than predicted. The last safety services levy in the Township was approved by our residents in 2015. That levy was projected to last only five years and was able to be extended well beyond its projected lifetime through fiscal discipline. The Police and Fire & EMS departments pursued a variety of alternative funding sources such as grants and cost-recovery mechanisms to allow for this levy to last longer than projected, however, a new levy will allow the Township to continue providing the level of service residents have come to expect.

Since the passage of the 2015 levy, the cost of goods and services has continued to increase as each resident is fully aware. Additionally, the population in the Township has grown almost ten percent in the past 11 years resulting in a significantly higher call volume for the Fire & EMS Department as our population has aged, and our safety and healthcare needs have grown. The Police Department's focus on crime prevention has kept calls for service relatively flat over that same period. In fact, the Township is proud that in 2025 it was found by *Safewise.com* to be one of the safest communities in Ohio with a population over 40,000 residents.

Safety Services Levy Info *(Continued)*

What does a 3.1 mil levy mean for the residents of the Township? The current safety services levy that is providing funding for safety services in the Township is based on property values in place in 2015. Therefore, if approved by voters, a new safety services levy will allow the Township to account for and take into consideration the growth that has occurred in the Township since the passage of the last safety services levy. In Ohio, residential property is taxed at 35% of the market value. If approved by voters, this levy equals \$109 per \$100,000 of home market value per year. This levy would begin providing funding to the two safety service departments by mid-2027.

What are the levy funds used for? This is an additional levy which means it would add new revenue that would be restricted by statute and can only be used by the Township’s safety service agencies including the Police and Fire & EMS departments. It could be used for the purchase of safety and rescue equipment, vehicle replacement, facility and infrastructure needs, and personnel costs needed to staff and operate these two important departments in the Township.

Why is a safety service levy being proposed now? A review of the existing Safety Services Fund indicates that 2026 is the last year that the fund will be solvent. Projections from the Clermont County Auditor indicate that all funds will be spent by the end of fiscal year 2027. In the absence of a new levy, the Safety Services Fund will experience a deficit of over \$1 million that will need to be accounted for unless the current level of services is significantly reduced.

Residents will have the opportunity to consider the proposed safety services levy on the May 5, 2026, primary ballot. Additional information is also available on the Township’s website at *MiamiTwpOH.gov*.

Strategic Crime Prevention Efforts Making Township Safer

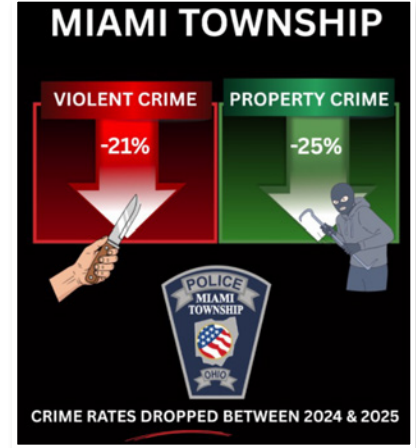

Miami Township has consistently been ranked as one of Ohio’s safest communities with both violent crime and property crime rates far lower than the state and national averages.

Over the last year, the Miami Township Police Department focused on strategic crime prevention to make our community even safer. Violent crime and property crime were both targeted. Every division of the police department was involved in these efforts which included robust community engagement, working with local businesses and places of worship, and involving our volunteers from the Citizens Police Academy

Alumni Association (CPAAA) in bolstering guardianship over hot spot locations. The strategic crime prevention efforts have produced tangible results in 2025. Compared to 2024, violent crime is down 21% and property crime is down 25%.



A prime example of the strategic crime prevention programming in play is the “Stop the Scam” initiative. This program, involving the Miami Township Police Department, Miami Township Fire & EMS, and CPAAA, focuses on reducing senior citizen scam victimization through public education and partnerships with local businesses. In this program, senior citizens are educated in person about the common tactics that scammers use to attempt to victimize them. The program also trains frontline employees at local merchants to recognize indicators of potential scam victimization as well as strategies on how to intervene. Moreover, and in cooperation with local businesses, the program posts reminder messages at gift card displays and at points of purchase recognizing that this is likely the “last chance” to prevent the scam victimization.

The Miami Township Police Department remains committed to making our community a safe place to live, work, and play. Our residents play a vital role in this effort, and we are always looking for opportunities to partner in 2026 and beyond!

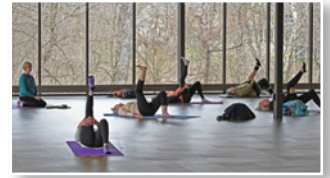

Emergency Vehicle Planning & Development

Every day, Miami Township Fire and EMS vehicles, ambulances and fire apparatus alike, travel throughout the community responding to emergencies. Many residents may not realize that these vehicles are custom-built specifically for fire and EMS operations. Emergency vehicles, particularly fire apparatus, are highly specialized and engineered to perform distinct functions based on operational needs. During station tours, firefighters often describe a fire engine as a “toolbox on wheels” and an ambulance as a “rolling emergency room,” each carrying extensive equipment to manage fires, medical emergencies, rescues, hazardous materials incidents, and a wide range of other hazards. Unlike typical commercial vehicles, emergency apparatus are frequently placed into service operating at or near their maximum gross vehicle weight (GVW) from day one. They are expected to perform under demanding conditions, acceleration, braking, extended idling, and continuous use, often multiple times per day. The specifications for each vehicle are driven by the community’s needs and are designed to provide a long, reliable service life in an emergency environment.

The wear and tear on emergency service vehicles is impactful and necessary. In 2025, Miami Township Fire and EMS ambulances and fire apparatus responded to more than 7,200 incidents and logged over 168,874 miles. These figures reflect not just distance traveled, but the intense and unforgiving nature of emergency response, underscoring the importance of proper vehicle design, maintenance, and timely replacement to ensure continued reliability and safety for both responders and the community they serve.

Currently, the lead time for a new ambulance is up to two years, and for a new fire truck, up to 30 months. Planning for a new vehicle begins

three years before its delivery. A committee of firefighter/paramedics, operators, and officers is assembled to discuss the configuration of the apparatus. They specify components such as compartmentation, equipment, hose loads, water capacity, and power supply to the manufacturer. The committee is responsible for assessing current needs while also considering future requirements. We recently received a new ambulance ordered over two years ago, and we currently



have a fire truck on order with an expected delivery this summer, placed in 2024. The fire truck is expected to have a service life of 15 years, serving our department and community. During that time, developments within the Township and technological advancements will evolve, and the truck will need to adapt. Special attention is given to the longevity of emergency vehicles. Multiple components are specified to ensure the apparatus remains operational and durable. Often, retired vehicles are repurposed for other agencies; for example, our last three fire trucks were sold to emergency service agencies in Guatemala, Mexico, and Tennessee.

The manufacturing process starts with pieces of aluminum and steel. These pieces are stamped, extruded, and molded into parts. Welding technicians and metal fabricators assemble these parts to build the cab, body, and other components. Electricians wire lighting, sirens, and computers that control various systems. Several other companies produce parts and components for emergency vehicles, including suspension parts, axles, brakes, computers, and transmissions. Currently, due to

emissions standards, only one diesel engine manufacturer remains. Fire department representatives visit the manufacturer to perform a mid-point inspection before the body is mounted, adding an extra layer of quality control and ensuring the specifications are met. Once the truck is assembled, a comprehensive set of tests is conducted to verify that it meets the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standard 1900. Before delivery, fire department representatives conduct a final inspection to ensure the apparatus operates and performs as specified.

When the apparatus is delivered, the equipment is installed, and operators undergo training along with extensive over-the-road driving before it

begins service. Once in operation, scheduled maintenance is carried out to ensure the vehicle’s longevity. Currently, the fire department does not have its own mechanic, so vehicles are sent to a nearby service center where technicians with the required skills and training as Emergency Vehicle Technicians (EVTs) perform preventive maintenance and repairs. EVT training emphasizes the strict standards established by NFPA 1911. Additionally, annual testing requirements are followed. For fire apparatus, NFPA Standards 1901 and 1914 specify the yearly testing for fire pumps and aerial devices. Annual testing is also performed on specific equipment, including fire hose, self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA), and ground ladders.

The next time you see an ambulance or a fire truck responding to an emergency, you now know that it is a vehicle that results from hundreds of hours of planning and development. The emergency vehicles for Miami Township were specifically built to meet the community’s needs and are cared for to ensure they continue to serve the residents of Miami Township into the future.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone that there are rules that have been set in place to preserve the Parks and make

I would like to highlight a couple of the Park Rules as we receive questions or see issues often involving the following:

Hours Of Operation: All Parks shall be open from dawn to dusk or at such other times as the Board or the Township Administrator authorizes.

Roadways, paths, walks, and trails established for pedestrian travel shall not be used for motorized travel except motorized wheelchairs.

I have highlighted these rules as we often find that people enter the Parks over the nighttime hours and drive vehicles into areas of the Parks where vehicles are not permitted. In doing so they often cause damage to the grass or drain lines in the Parks.
