




Police Department Services How would you rate the overall performance of the Miami Township Police Department?










The 2025 "Safest Cities in Ohio" report from SafeWise.com has been released and Miami Township remained the safest community in Ohio with a population over 40,000 residents.







Miami Township's violent crime rate for the last year was 0.51 per 1,000 people, far under the national violent crime rate of 3.6 per 1,000 people.

Miami Township's property crime rate for the last year was 7.25 per 1,000 people, far under the national property crime rate of 19.1 per 1,000 people.


CALLS FOR SERVICE (THROUGH 2024)










Miami Township Fire Stations Clermont County, OH


